WHEREAS, Cities of Lake Oswego, Rivergrove and West Linn have requested time extensions to complete Title 3 compliance work based on evidence showing "substantial progress or proof of good cause" for failing to meet the January 27, 2000 deadline for compliance with Title 3 of the Functional Plan and have submitted timelines showing when the work will be completed, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the Cities of Lake Oswego, Rivergrove and West Linn shall receive time extensions for compliance with Title 3 of the Functional Plan as shown in Exhibit A.

2. That any further requests for time extensions or requests for Functional Plan exceptions made by the above named jurisdictions shall be determined as delineated in Metro Code 3.07.820, Sections B and C.

Committee Action: At its February 8, 2000 meeting, the Growth Management Committee voted 3-0 to recommend Council adoption of Resolution 00-2897. Voting in favor: Councilors Monroe, Washington and Park.

Background:

- Existing Law—Title 3 of the Urban Growth Management Functional Plan requires all jurisdictions to comply by January 27, 2000. Title 8 allows time extensions to that deadline to be granted by the Metro Council "if the city or county has demonstrated substantial progress or proof of good cause for failing to complete the requirements on time."
- Budget Impact—There is no budget impact.

Committee Issues/Discussion: Mary Weber of the Growth Management Services Department, gave the staff presentation. Four jurisdictions are in currently in compliance with Metro adopted Title 3, ten more, in Washington County, are in substantial compliance. Resolution 00-2897 finds that the three named jurisdictions have shown "substantial progress or proof of good cause for failing to meet the January 27, 2000 deadline for compliance with Title 3 of the Functional Plan, and have submitted timelines showing when the work will be completed."

Approval of these extensions extends the deadlines to March 2000 for West Linn and June 2000 for Lake Oswego and Rivergrove. Portland, Troutdale and Johnson City remain to yet either have complied with Title 3, or have an extension request approved.

PROPOSED ACTION

Adoption of Resolution No. 00-2897 granting a timeline extension to the Functional Plan compliance deadline for the Title 3: Water Quality and Flood Management to the Cities of Lake Oswego, Rivergrove and West Linn.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

Metro Code 3.07.820.C (Title 8 of the Functional Plan) provides that Metro Council may grant time extensions to Functional Plan requirements if a jurisdiction can demonstrate "substantial progress or proof of good cause for failing to complete the requirements on time."

On June 18, 1999, the cities and counties reported on their progress for compliance with the requirements of Title 3 of the Functional Plan. Throughout the region, the local jurisdictions have made considerable progress in dealing with flood management, erosion and sediment control and protection of the water quality resource areas. Each jurisdiction has elements of the requirements in place and is working towards amending current standards to be consistent with Title 3. The letters requesting the time extensions are attached to this report. A matrix showing the Title 3 compliance status of each of the jurisdictions is attached.

Compliance Progress

Lake Oswego

June 2000

The City is largely in compliance with the requirements of Title 3. Lake Oswego needs to adopt balance cut and fill regulations for development in the flood plains and to develop a means of updating the Water Quality and Floodplain Area Maps. A time extension to June 2000 is requested to prepare the code amendments and bring them through the public hearing process.

Rivergrove

June 2000

Rivergrove has requested a time extension to June 2000 to meet the requirements of Title 3. The City has in place balanced cut and fill requirements for development in the floodplain. Proposed code language to meet the remainder of the requirements of the functional plan has been prepared and has been reviewed by Metro staff. Minor amendments to the proposed code have been identified that will bring the City into compliance with Title 3.

West Linn

March 2000

The City has provided Metro staff with proposed code language to meet the remainder of the requirements of the functional plan. This has been reviewed and minor amendments to the proposed code have been identified that will bring the City into compliance with Title 3. The proposed code is going through the public hearing process and adoption in anticipated in March 2000.

BUDGET IMPACT

Adoption of this resolution has no budget impact.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

The Functional Plan implementation time extension requests to the requirements of Title 3 for Lake Oswego, Rivergrove and West Linn are recommended for approval. Any further requests for time extensions or requests for Functional Plan exceptions made by the City would be determined as delineated in Metro Code 3.07.820, Sections B and C.

In response to your letter of October 29, 1999, the City would like to request extensions to several Urban Growth Management Functional Plan Requirements.

The attached proposed Compliance Schedule shows newly requested compliance dates in **bold** and previously requested dates as struck. The City will not be able to 1) adopt Title 1, minimum densities, 2) adopt Title 3, requirements for balanced cut and fill in the floodplain, 3) hold at least one public hearing prior to adoption of changes to comply with Title 3, 4) develop a means of updating Water Quality/Floodplain Area Maps, 5) adopt design standards for street connectivity, or 6) adopt alternative mode split targets and identify actions to implement mode split targets, until June, 2000.

There are several reasons for these delays. There is a vacancy in the Long Range Planning Division and staffing commitments that are also taking time, including annexation processing and neighborhood planning.

Dear Mr. Burton:

The City of Rivergrove hereby requests an extension until June 18, 2000 for adopting local ordinances that will fully implement Title 3 of Metro's Regional Framework Plan. Some aspects of your Title 3 ordinance (balanced cut and fill requirements, for example) have already been implemented, but our principal Title 3 ordinance has not yet been adopted.

Our principal Title 3 ordinance will be the result of a totally volunteer effort by our Citizens Advisory Committee. They have been working diligently on the matter, and have coordinated their efforts and interim products with members of the Metro staff. We are, of course, grateful for the support and guidance that has been available from your staff. With no staff or financial resources available for this matter (see below), we are unable to meet the original implementation schedule. The new requirement to give DLCD notice 45 days prior to the first evidentiary hearing increases our need for an extension.

For the past two or three years, the City's very limited land use resources have been to a great extent consumed trying to protect our water quality and flood management areas from inappropriate development. Our efforts to protect the exact same resource values and functions that are the focus of your Title 3 ordinance have included extended litigation that we could ill afford. Thus far we have been very successful in those efforts, but we were unable to complete our Title 3 ordinance during that time period. Pending the adoption of our Title 3 ordinance, we will continue our efforts to protect and preserve the integrity of our streams, wetlands and floodplains. We will also diligently pursue Title 3 implementation at the earliest possible time.

Thank you in advance for your kind attention to this matter.

Dear Mr. Burton:

On behalf of the City of West Linn, I respectfully request an extension to the deadline of December 31, 1999 to meet Functional Plan requirements. The first public hearing concerning the relevant Comprehensive Plan amendments was November 17, before the Planning Commission. This body has continued the public hearing to December 8. Staff anticipates that the Commission will also deliberate at this time whether or not to continue the public hearing to a date in January, after the holidays. It is staff's recommendation that the Commission forward the Plan to the City Council before the first of the year, with another round of public hearings before this body starting in January.

Please find enclosed copies of the November draft Comprehensive Plan and File NO. MISC-99-37 staff report. The staff report recommends that an amended 2040 Growth Concept design type map be adopted as part of the Comprehensive Plan. Staff is also recommending that green corridor policies be incorporated included in the Goal 5 section of the Plan (please see attached response to Metro's 10/12/99 evaluation report). Staff's recommendations to Planning Commission and City Council are cited in the MISC-99-37 staff report and are detailed in the City's August report to Metro.

Amendments to the City's Community Development Code that are relevant to Functional Plan compliance will go to public hearing on December 1, 1999. It is unlikely that these Code amendments will be adopted by the end of the year, but it is staff's hope that they will be heard by City Council in January 2000, and adopted shortly thereafter. While we anticipate approval of both the plan and code amendments by the end of January, the hearing process is unpredictable. Therefore, we are requesting an extension to March 30, 2000.

REGIONAL FUNCTIONAL PLAN REQUIREMENTS CITY OF WEST LINN

In response to the Evaluation of West Linn's Functional Plan Compliance Report, Draft 10/12/99

Concerning review of the City's compliance efforts by Functional Plan title:

Metro Code 3.07.120 (Title 1, Section 2): Housing and employment capacity

The analysis of both vacant land and infill development potential was not affected by the change from 80% to 70% minimum density requirements. Buildout was calculated assuming 100% density with adjustments made for street right of ways and Title III constraints.

Metro Code 3.07.130 (Title 1, Section 3): Design type boundaries

Staff is recommending that the City adopt a map showing the 2040 Growth Concept design types as part of the Comprehensive Plan (see page 13 of the staff report MISC-99-37, "Major Issues" #3). Per the compliance report submitted in August of 1999, the City is requesting that Metro consider new designations for areas of Willamette, Robinwood, along Highway 43, and the Tanner Basin commercial area.

Metro Code 3.07.510 (Title 5): Neighbor cities and rural reserves

Title 5 is addressed in the "major issues" section of the staff report (see page 14, #4). Staff is recommending that two new policies be added to the Goal 5 section of the Comprehensive Plan recognizing the green corridor adjacent to West Linn and adopting green corridor policies as described in the 2040 Growth Concept.
