Resolution No. 00-2911: For the purpose of directing the Metro Committee on Citizen Involvement to examine Campaign Finance Proposals.

Action Taken: This matter is before the Metro Operations Committee. No action has been taken as of this date.

Existing Law: There is no relevant ORS or Metro Code siting regarding initiatives and the review by MCCI. The 1992 Metro Charter created MCCI.

Background: The Metro Council will discuss at the Metro Operations Committee matters involving Campaign Finance Reform and potential options surrounding such issues, including but not limited to review by MCCI on potential initiatives on this subject.
