## **STAFF REPORT**

IN CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. 00-2977 FOR THE PURPOSE OF AUTHORIZING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A 3.7 PERCENT COST OF LIVING ADJUSTMENT FOR METRO NON-REPRESENTED EMPLOYEES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2000-01

#### **BACKGROUND**

Metro Code section 2.02.035(d) states, in part, that "the executive officer with prior notice to the Metro council may annually revise salary ranges by an amount not to exceed the percentage increase to the national Consumers Price Index-W (Urban Wage Earners) calculated annually from March to March". On June 26, 2000, the executive officer notified council of his intent to increase non-represented employee salary ranges by 3.7 percent effective July 1, 2000, consistent with the increase which will be applied for represented employees in accordance with applicable bargaining agreement

#### ANALYSIS/INFORMATION

The proposed increase does not exceed the National Consumers Price Index-W from March 1999 to March 2000 which increased by 4.0 percent. However, the 2000-01 budget included only a 2 percent cost-of-living adjustment. The additional 1.7 percent, represents a difference of an estimated \$515,000 between the approved budget COLA of 2.0 percent and the executive officer's salary revision for fiscal year 2000-01 of 3.7 percent, with an excise tax impact of \$76,400.

The executive officer has requested Metro department directors to absorb their respective share of the the increased cost within existing appropriations, so as not to increase the budget. In addition, the executive officer has stated his intent to monitor the impact of the increased COLA as the year progresses, and to propose budget amendments, if needed.

## **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

That the Council:

- 1. Adopt Resolution No. 00-2977, for the purpose of authorizing implementation of a 3.7 percent cost of living adjustment for Metro non-represented employees for fiscal year 2000-01
- 2. Instruct the executive officer to submit to Council, by September 30, 2000, a delineation of each department's proposed means of absorbing the increase within existing appropriations.
