THE METROPOLITAN SERVICE DISTRICT HEREIN ORDAINS THE FOLLOWING:

SECTION I

The Solid Waste Management Action Plan Volumes I, II and III(plan) dated March 8, 1974 is modified to reduce the number of processing/transfer stations from four to two processing/transfer stations to be located in North Portland and Oregon City and one transfer station to be located in Washington County. The construction schedule for the reduced system will be phased to build one processing/transfer station and one transfer station initially with the second processing/transfer station to be constructed by 1980.

SECTION II

In order to submit to the State Emergency Board at the Earliest Possible date, revised engineering and financial data for the Reduced system and to provide for the timely implementation of the Plan, an emergency is declared to exist.

The Department of Environmental Quality has received a copy of Ordinance #31 which was adopted on August 8, 1975 by the Metropolitan Service District (MSD).

Ordinance #31 modifies the Solid Waste Management Action Plan as adopted by Ordinance #9 by reduction of the solid waste processing system from four transfer-processing stations to two transfer-processing stations and one transfer station.
