ORDINANCE NO, 44

The Metropolitan Service District herein ordains the following:

SECTION 1. Section 12.16.180, Administrative Fees, is amended to read:

12.16.180 Administrative Fees:

- 1) The fees authorized in this section shall be used only for the establishment and administration of the MSD Tire Processing and Disposal Program.
- 2) The Board of the Metropolitan Service District authorizes a fee of 3 cents to be paid by the individual, general, and special project processing centers, tire salvage centers, and persons carrying scrap tires outside of the MSD boundaries for the purpose of salvage to the Metropolitan Service District for each motor vehicle tire.

SECTION 2. Section 12.18.100 is amended to read:

12.18.100 Bonds:

- 1) Every applicant for a permit or renewal of a permit under Chapter 12.16.020 shall deliver to MSD a permit or license bond in the sum of \$1000 in favor of MSD and in a satisfactory form.
- 2) Every applicant for a permit or a renewal of a permit under Chapter 12.16.110 shall deliver to MSD a permit or license bond in the sum of \$10,000 in favor of MSD and in a satisfactory form.
- 3) Every applicant for a permit under Chapter 12.16.115 shall deliver to MSD a permit or license bond in a sum commensurate with the special project to be undertaken by the applicant.
- 4) Bonds shall be executed by the applicant as principal and by a corporate surety authorized to transact business in Oregon.

- 5) A permit holder is responsible for costs and expenses incurred by MSD when a permit holder has violated the conditions of his permit or the MSD Code, including without limitation, administrative and legal expenses and the costs of cleaning up or rectifying any violation. All bonds shall protect MSD against such costs and expenses.


SECTION 3. Section 12.16.115 is added to and made a part of the MSD Code:

12.16.115 Special Project Processing Center Permit:

No person may act as a special project processing center within the area of the MSD without first obtaining a permit from the District.
