WHEREAS, there are vacancies in MCCI membership and one appointment correction to be made; and


WHEREAS, a recruitment and selection process has been initiated, resulting in the nomination of the following citizens to MCCI:

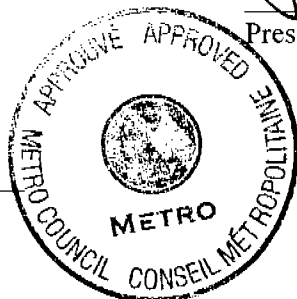

BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF RESOLUTION

This resolution is simply meant to appoint two new members to the Metro Committee for Citizen Involvement (MCCI) and re-appoint one member to the correct district and position.

EXISTING LAW

Metro Code Chapter 2.12 and MCCI's bylaws are the relevant legal documents related to this appointment. Both currently state that MCCI will nominate appointees to vacant positions and the Metro Council will give final approval.

BACKGROUND

For some time now, MCCI has had several vacancies, which we continue to attempt to fill. In addition to personal contacts, we have sent mailers and done some advertising. We thank the Metro Council for making contacts and sending us leads as well.

From District 1, Shannon Turk, is a budget analyst at the city of Gresham. She is involved in her local community as a member of the Troutdale Citizen Advisory Committee. One of her goals is to act as a liaison between Troutdale and its citizens and Metro and MCCI. She wants to help bring the concerns of small communities to the table. Shannon has also been involved in Census 2000 and has, as part of her work, presented to Council and Council committees on various issues.

Gil Cobb lives in District 7. He is in a unique area, a section of unincorporated Washington County that is surrounded by other cities and wants to participate in his community in new ways. In the past community involvement has meant coaching and acting as a board member for local soccer clubs and volunteering with the PSU Clean Water Festival for Children. Now he is getting involved in his neighborhood association and rightly recognizes that citizens need to be aware of what is going on at Metro.
