Metro Council-MPAC Coordinating Committee Meeting Notes for 7/9/97

Present: Kvistad, Drake, McLain, Naito, Hammerstad, Farm

1. Calendar Review

Councilor McLain reviewed the three land-use related calendars; Framework Plan, Housing Needs Analysis and Urban Growth Report, Urban Growth Boundary

Framework Plan--June, July and August are meant to be "big read" time for MPAC. This is an opportunity to see what's missing or what needs to be added. Housing and school issues have been identified so far. MPAC can also identify areas where it is in basic agreement with the draft Framework Plan. The August 13 date identified on the calendar for MPAC recommendation, would be better identified as an opportunity for MPAC to identify issues or areas that need further study or deliberation. More work can be done by MPAC in August and September, with final recommendation to Council on or before September 24.

<u>Urban Growth Report</u>--MPAC will strive to have recommendations ready by July 23. If not, then by their second August meeting. The ultimate goal is to have recommendations to Council before the first Council meeting in September.

<u>Urban Growth Boundary Process</u>--Dates on the calendar cover three years, and are somewhat preliminary. Executive Officer submits Metro code revisions in October. LUBA needs to render a decision on the tiering strategy in Metro's Urban Reserve decision, which is being appealed.

2. Direction From Council

<u>Framework Plan</u>--Kvistad sees very few big problems, here. Says local jurisdictions have knowledge and need to implement. McLain identifies emerging issues as schools, parks, water and affordable housing.

Drake encourages Council to welcome MPAC recommendations. Council still has final vote. Naito says policy debate is to be expected.

<u>Urban Growth Report</u>--Kvistad says that the Council has made some preliminary policy decisions that have been informed with MPAC recommendations. Now is time for refinement, not major policy rehash. Hammerstad thinks things will be OK as long as final decision is in the 8,000 to 10,000 acre range for 20 year land supply. Her assessment

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also assumes that MPAC will help to decide which sites to include, given specific criteria, over and above the already identified 4,000 acres of first tier sites.

With regard to Urban Reserves, Hammerstad says what is needed now is a legal process that will help provide a solution when local citizens are unhappy with lot-line-specific urban reserve decisions. If there could be such a process, then when urban reserve planning begins, there will be a clear boundary to work with. McLain and Kvistad agree. McLain says first step towards such a process will be new code updating beginning in October. Action could then be triggered at the request of a county, at the request of a property owner, or through a locational adjustment request.

3. Housekeeping Michael Morrissey will be lead staff for this committee. Next meeting time will be Tuesday, July 15, 4 PM. at Metro.
