WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Service District (Metro) qualifies as a municipal corporation under Oregon Revised Statutes, chapter 268, and is authorized to certify facilities for the disposal of solid waste; and

WHEREAS, Metro has adopted a Solid Waste Management Plan that encourages efficient and ecologically sound recycling, reuse, recovery and disposal of solid waste; and

WHEREAS, Metro has adopted a Code that establishes rules and regulations for the issuance of a certificate to operate a solid waste disposal facility; and

WHEREAS, Section 12.02.200 of the Metro Code allows the Council to grant variances to specific rules, regulations or ordinances if it is determined that the purpose and intent of a particular requirement can be achieved without strict compliance; and

WHEREAS, Multnomah County is constructing a new county shop at the old Vance Pit sanitary landfill and has requested variances to specific sections of Metro's Code in order to facilitate said project; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED,

1. That the Council of the Metropolitan Service District finds that it is consistent with Metro's Solid Waste Management Plan

and is in the best interest of the public to grant the following variances to the Metro Code in order to facilitate the County's project:

Section 12.02.090 (4) Waive the requirement for a surety bond.

Section 12.02.100 (2) Waive the requirement that Metro's staff provide a thirty (30) day period of time for public and other interested parties to submit written comments pertinent to Multnomah County's application. As a condition of this waiver immediately Multnomah County will/notify persons within a 2,000 foot radius of the proposed project.

<u>Section 12.02.140</u> Multnomah County is relieved from paying user fees on the solid waste that is relocated. <u>Section 20.02.100</u> Multnomah County need not submit a complete technical feasibility study report. Only those portions will be required that are determined by Metro's staff to be appropriate.
