**Airline Reservations** 

Effective July 1, 2002, Metro will be participating with the State of Oregon and other local governments in a contract to use Azumano Travel for a government rate on all airline travel. This program has four significant advantages:

- 1. The airline rates are competitive with internet travel rates
- 2. The tickets can be cancelled at any time with a full refund
- 3. The tickets can be changed at any time with no additional costs
- 4. Staff time is saved from needing to shop for a good rate on the phone or internet

As of July 1, Metro will be obligated to booking all airline travel through this program. In order to assure compliance, <u>airline travel</u> will be blocked from Metro's purchasing cards. Azumano can help to make any other travel arrangements (such as discounts on hotel/motel, car, train, etc.,) but we are not required to use them for this type of travel-related arrangement.

Each department has been asked to have one person designated to be trained in making reservations. Sherri Gilleo will be our designated airline travel reservationist for this program, with Chris Billington as a back-up.
