#### ISSUE & BACKGROUND

The purpose today's briefing is to provide Council with:

- 1. a review of the variance decision process;
- 2. a review of the events leading to two variance requests; and
- 3. an overview of the staff recommendation for two variance requests.

Variance requests trigger a process that allows Council to consider situations where specific Code requirements can not be met by a regulated person. The Code, in Chapter 5.01.110, establishes a two-part test for variances:

- 1. the purpose and intent of a particular requirement can be achieved without compliance; and
- 2. a particular requirement is inappropriate because of conditions beyond the control of an applicant or when compliance would be considered extremely burdensome or highly impractical, due to special physical conditions or causes.

Council may grant a variance if it finds a requesting party meets both parts of the test.

Hillsboro Landfill and Lakeside Landfill have both requested a variance from meeting the Enhanced Dry Waste Recovery Program (EDWRP) recovery requirements (i.e. both landfills have requested to continue taking unprocessed dry waste) from January 1, 2009 until July 1, 2009 – a six-month time variance. The purpose and intent of EDWRP is, starting January 1, 2009, to achieve higher recovery in the region by requiring all dry waste go to material recovery facilities (MRFs) rather than disposal at landfills. This diversion of dry waste from landfills to MRFs is estimated to achieve an additional 33,000 tons of new recovery each year. This new recovered tonnage would come primarily from the dry waste currently being disposed of at Hillsboro and Lakeside landfills.

On August 17, 2007, Council adopted EDWRP with an effective date of January 1, 2009. Council intended for new dry waste recovery to begin in 2009 in order to meet the state-mandated 64% regional recovery goal while also recognizing the need for a six-month period to provide time for facilities to meet the 15% performance standard. EDWRP also requires all Metro-designated landfills to certify whether they intend to remain designated facilities or not. Effective July 1, 2008, designated facilities must certify their intent to meet the EDWRP recovery requirements (i.e. either only take processing residual from MRFs or become a MRF). By November 1, 2008, new designated facility agreements are required to be in place. If Metro and a designated facility are unable to establish an agreement by November 1, then Metro shall terminate the existing agreement by December 31, 2008.

Hillsboro Landfill certified its intent to comply with EDWRP by constructing a building in which to conduct dry waste recovery (Tualatin Valley Waste Recovery). Hillsboro Landfill also requested a variance until from January 1, 2009 until July 1, 2009 to fully comply with EDWRP. Lakeside Landfill provided a certification of intent but indicated it was not willing to recover dry waste or only dispose of dry waste residual received from other MRFs. Lakeside also requested a variance that would allow it to continue taking dry waste from January 1, 2009 until it closed under its DEQ permit on July 1, 2009.

# **OPTIONS AVAILABLE**

Staff has reviewed the two variance requests against the variance tests and plans to file a staff report with a COO recommendation on October 9. Council is scheduled to consider the variance requests at its October 23 meeting. At the meeting, Council may also consider the comments offered by the applicants and the public in its decision. Council can consider approval, denial or approval with conditions of the two variance requests.

## **IMPLICATIONS AND SUGGESTIONS**

Preliminary staff recommendations on the variance requests are as follows:

- □ Hillsboro Landfill variance request. Staff recommends finding Waste Management meets both parts of the variance test related to EDWRP on January 1, 2009. Metro Council should grant a variance until July 1, 2009 to allow Waste Management to complete construction of its new MRF building. Council may wish to consider placing conditions on Waste Management to conduct some minimal level of processing on dry waste from January until July (or whenever the MRF building is completed.) <sup>1</sup>
- □ **Lakeside Landfill variance request.** Staff recommends finding Lakeside does not meet either of the variance tests related to EDWRP on January 1, 2009 and, based on its certification of intent, does not intend to do so.
