CONSIDERATION OF A SIX-MONTH EXTENSION IN THE TERMS OF THE PUBLIC AND INDUSTRY REPRESENTATIVES TO THE SOLID WASTE POLICY ALTERNATIVES COMMITTEE

FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

The By-laws of the Solid Waste Policy Alternatives Committee (SWPAC) provide that industry representatives and general public representatives be appointed by the Presiding Officer for terms of two years. The current terms for those SWPAC members expire in Feburary 1984.

In January, the Regional Services Committee recommended that the Council Assistant develop alternatives for the structure and function of the Solid Waste committees including SWPAC. On February 7 the Regional Services Committee voted to recommend that expiring SWPAC memberships be extended for six months. This would allow time for careful study of the structure and function while retaining experienced committee members to aid the Council in its decision-making during the coming months. Recently, staff received a communication from John Grey, the Multnomah County Public representative. He stated that he would be unable to serve any longer on SWPAC due to business commitments. It is recommended that his position be left vacant for this six-month period.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Officer recommends that the terms of the public and industry representatives to SWPAC be extended for six months.

COMMITTEE CONSIDERATION AND RECOMMENDATION

On February 7, 1984, the Regional Services Committee recommended that the Council extend the expiring memberships for six months.
