WHEREAS, the region's parks, trails and natural areas are operated and maintained by a diverse array of federal, state, regional and local agencies; and

WHEREAS, in June 2007 Mayor Richard M. Daley of the City of Chicago and Mr. David Fisher of the Great Rivers Greenway District of the St. Louis Metropolitan Area travelled to Portland and inspired us to dramatically increase our efforts to improve on the parks and recreation assets which nature and past generations have left us; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest that each agency in our region continue to maintain its own operational autonomy, local control and identity while also working in voluntary partnership with sister agencies and volunteer groups to present a united and attractive image to the public at large; and

WHEREAS, a unifying name and identity for the region's parks, trails and natural areas would help integrate communications and provide more broad information to the users, whether they be residents or tourists; and

WHEREAS, an unprecedented coalition of voluntary and nonprofit organizations, businesses and government agencies, including the Metro Council, have come together to promote, develop and protect the region's network of parks, trails and natural areas; and

WHEREAS, this coalition originally named itself "The Connecting Green Alliance" and was recognized by the Metro Council as such; and

WHEREAS, the Connecting Green Alliance worked with stakeholders and communications professionals to determine that the region's network of parks, trails and natural areas should continue to be operated with local control while being visually and thematically united under the name "The Intertwine"; and

WHEREAS, September 18<sup>th</sup>, 2009 is PARK(ing) Day, an annual, one-day, global event where citizens celebrate parks and greenspaces by temporarily transforming metered auto parking places into miniature parks; and

WHEREAS, the varied constituent agencies and organizations composing the Connecting Green Alliance have determined that PARK(ing) Day is a terrific occasion to launch The Intertwine; and

WHEREAS, the Connecting Green Alliance has determined that it should no longer be known as the Connecting Green Alliance but should now be known as The Intertwine Alliance;

now therefore

## BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. The Metro Council recognizes the region's network of regional parks, trails and natural areas as "The Intertwine."
- 2. The Metro Council declares that parks, trails and natural areas managed by the Metro Council shall be deemed part of The Intertwine.
- 3. The Metro Council recognizes the Connecting Green Alliance under its new name, The Intertwine Alliance.
- 4. The Metro Council reaffirms its support for, and membership in, the Intertwine Alliance.

ADOPTED by the Metro Council this 17<sup>th</sup> day of September, 2009.
