1. CALL TO ORDER AND DECLARATION OF A QUORUM

Chair Robin McArthur declared a quorum and called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m.

2. <u>COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS</u>

Mr. Rian Windsheimer updated the committee on ODOT's State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). A list of ODOT administered projects was released to JPACT for review at its September 10th meeting. The project list is being incorporated into a draft STIP, for a public comment period beginning in October 2009. After the comments have been collected and taken into account, all ODOT administered projects, transit projects and regional flexible fund projects will be programmed in the Metropolitan TIP and an air quality conformity analysis and findings will be prepared. JPACT and other relevant jurisdictions will vote on adoption of the 2010-13 MTIP, including the ODOT administered projects, in the summer of 2010.

3. CITIZEN COMMUNICATIONS TO TPAC ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS

There were none.

4. <u>FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS</u>

Chair McArthur briefly overviewed future agenda items. Committee members recommended High Speed Rail and status update on House Bill 2001 (e.g. congestion pricing) be added to the list of future agenda items. In addition, members requested that the TPAC and JPACT agendas be reviewed for consistency.

5. <u>CONSENT AGENDA</u>

Approval of TPAC Minutes from August 28, 2009

MOTION: Ms. Karen Schilling moved, Mr. Alan Lehto seconded, to adopt the August 28, 2009 meeting minutes.

ACTION TAKEN: With all in favor, the motion passed.

6. ACTION ITEMS

6.1 Resolution No. 09-4069, For the Purpose of Updating the Transportation Planning Public Involvement Policy to Conform to Public Involvement Requirements in the Current Federal Transportation Authorization Act

Ms. Pat Emmerson of Metro presented the draft Public Involvement Policy for Transportation Planning, which conforms to public involvement requirements in the current federal Transportation Authorization Act. Adoption of this resolution would approve the updated

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policies, enabling the draft to become the practice in Metro's overall regional transportation planning process.

MOTION: Mr. Paul Smith moved, Ms. Elissa Gertler seconded, to adopt Resolution No. 09-4069.

ACTION TAKEN: With all in favor, the motion passed.

6.2 Resolution No. 09-XXXX, For the Purpose of Adopting the Sunrise Project Preferred Alternative

Mr. Ron Weinman of Clackamas County provided a presentation on the Sunrise Project Preferred Alternative. The Sunrise Corridor between I-205 and US 26 is a key component of an integrated transportation system that includes short-term and long-term improvements as well as long-range planning to meet projected growth and travel demand in Clackamas County. This project is needed to promote livability, improve freight flow, promote economic development, decrease congestion, and serve areas of expansion and growth. Adoption of this resolution would and endorse the full build-out of the Sunrise Project Preferred Alternative, and commits to support funding transportation projects within the Sunrise Project.

The presentation covered the following issues:

- What the sunrise project is today;
- Forecast population and employment growth, 2005-2030;
- 2030 Without the Sunrise:
- Committees Recommend Preferred Alternative;
- Change in Travel Demand;
- Additional Preferred Alternative Elements;
- Overall Environmental Findings;
- Project Cost and Funding;
- The project will need to be phased;
- PRC Agreed Menu of Projects for the Near Term (~10 years); and
- Schedule.

During committee discussion, Mr. Keith Liden was concerned that the Sunrise Project remains disconnected from regional aspirations of reducing carbon emissions and overall traffic via the expansion of lanes. Mr. Weinman and Mr. Windsheimer responded that future congestion issues resulting from escalating freight usage necessitates the Sunrise Project improvements, and phasing the project over the course of ten or more years will mitigate residual problems including congestion and rapid growth in the area. Furthermore, committee members discussed the inclusion of bike paths and alternative transportation options within the Sunrise Project.

MOTION: Ms. Elissa Gertler moved, Mr. Windsheimer seconded, to adopt the resolution.

<u>ACTION TAKEN</u>: With all in favor, one opposed (Liden), and two abstained (Lehto and Smith), the motion <u>passed</u>.

7. <u>INFORMATION / DISCUSSION ITEMS</u>

7.1 Making the Greatest Place (MGP)

Chief Operating Officer Recommendation on MGG

Chair McArthur provided an overview of the Chief Operating Officer Recommendation on MGP, and articulated the connection between the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and other elements of the MGP.

Draft Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Adoption Package

Ms. Kim Ellis of Metro provided an overview of the draft 2035 RTP Adoption Package, outlining the timeframe for adopting the RTP.

Draft Prioritization Criteria for Corridor Refinement Plans

Ms. Deborah Redman of Metro briefly overviewed the draft corridor refinement plan prioritization factors. She emphasized that in order to move forward, agreement is needed on the screening factors used to compare and prioritize the relative urgency of planning for future transportation improvements across the region's mobility corridors.

Committee members were asked to review and refine the prioritization factors, which will be used in the process to prioritize the proposed CRP by the end of 2009. The RTP workgroup is scheduled to discuss the refined CRP draft on October 5th.

7.2 ODOT Management Plan for American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) for 2009

Mr. Marty Anderson of ODOT briefed the committee on the ODOT management plan for America Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds. Of the \$100 million dollars to obligate statewide, \$47 million have been obligated, with a deadline of March 1st, 2010. Currently, ODOT is in the process of notifying local agencies on the current status of their projects; emphasizing the importance of having a contingency plan outlining their intent to use all monies received. Unused ARRA funds will be withdrawn from local agencies and reallocated by the Oregon Local Program Committee. In the Metro area, Metro staff will work with ODOT to reallocate unused ARRA funds consistent with the fail-safe strategy adopted by JPACT in May 2009.
