FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

Approval of these Resolutions is the final step in reaching agreement with Local 483 on wages for FY 1984-85. Resolution No. 82-515 authorizes the Executive Officer to sign the Addendum to the Collective Bargaining Agreement, and Resolution No. 84-516 amends the Metro Pay Plan to incorporate the agreed upon wage increase. The current bargaining agreement between Metro and the Union has a wage reopener provision for FY 1984-85. Representatives of the Union and Metro held several negotiating sessions between July 25, 1984, and October 12, 1984, reaching agreement on the latter date. The agreement provides for a \$.35 per hour wage increase for all Union employees retroactive to July 1, 1984. The Union has ratified this agreement. The estimated cost of this agreement including wages and fringe benefits is \$46,374. The budget and appropriation necessary to finance these costs will be brought to the Council with other mid-year budget adjustments.

The Executive Officer will forward to the Council a proposal providing for remuneration to Metro non-Union Zoo and Downtown employees, as discussed at the Executive Session on October 25, 1984.
