

WHEREAS, vacancies have occurred in the SWAC membership; and,



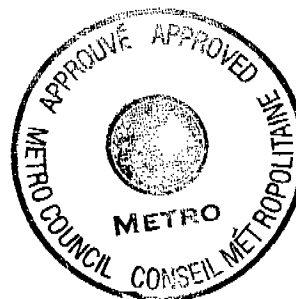

STAFF REPORT

IN CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. 03-3327 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENTS OF ANITA LARGENT, PAMELA PAVILONIS, WADE LANGE, THOMAS BADRICK, EILEEN NEWMAN AND MIKE HUYCKE TO THE SOLID WASTE ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SWAC)

BACKGROUND

The 23-member Solid Waste Advisory Committee (SWAC), representing recyclers, the hauling industry, disposal sites, citizen-ratepayers and local governments, evaluates policy options and presents recommendations to the Metro Council and Executive Officer regarding regional solid waste management and planning.

There are currently vacancies on the SWAC. Current Metro Code states that the Council President may appoint members and alternates to the SWAC subject to confirmation by the Metro Council. The following individuals have been appointed to the Metro SWAC, pending Council confirmation. These candidates have expressed interest in serving on Metro's SWAC and are qualified to advise Metro in the matters of solid waste management and planning. (See attachments for more information on each candidate.)

- ◆ Ms. Anita Largent, Solid Waste Manager for Clark County, Washington, has been recommended to serve as Clark County's representative (a non-voting position.)
- ◆ Dr. Pamela Pavilonis, a Naturopathic Physician with prior experience in environmental science, has been nominated as a business/rate-payer representative.
- ◆ Mr. Wade Lange, a Senior Property Manager with Ashforth Pacific, has been appointed as a business/rate-payer representative.
- ◆ Mr. Thomas Badrick, a Recycling Specialist with Legacy Health System, has been appointed as a business/rate-payer representative.
- ◆ Eileen Newman, a Master Recycler, has been appointed as Washington County's citizen representative.
- ◆ Mr. Mike Huycke, General Manager of Waste Control Systems, Portland Division, has been appointed as Mr. Merle Irvine's (disposal site representative) alternate.

ANALYSIS/INFORMATION

1. Known Opposition

There is no known opposition.

2. Legal Antecedents

ORS 192.610 "Governing Public Meetings", Metro Code Chapter 2.19.030, "Membership of the Advisory Committees" and 2.19.130, "Metro Solid Waste Advisory Committee", are the relevant legal documents related to these appointments.

3. Anticipated Effects

This resolution is intended to appoint Anita Largent, Pamela Pavilonis, Wade Lange, Tom Badrick, Eileen Newman, and Mike Huycke to two-year terms of service on the SWAC.

4. Budget Impacts

The Council President has reviewed the qualifications of Anita Largent, Pamela Pavilonis, Wade Lange, Tom Badrick, Eileen Newman, and Mike Huycke and finds them qualified to advise Metro in the matters of solid waste management and planning.
