1. CALL TO ORDER AND DECLARATION OF A QUORUM

Chair Robin McArthur called the meeting to order and declared a quorum at 9:34 a.m.

2. COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Chair McArthur stated that staff will be working to add items from the "future agenda" to the upcoming agenda.

3. <u>CITIZEN COMMUNICATIONS TO TPAC ON NON-AGENDA ITEMS</u>

There was none.

4. CONSENT AGENDA

<u>MOTION</u>: Mr. Paul Smith moved, Mr. Alan Lehto seconded, to approve the TPAC minutes from January 7, 2011.

ACTION TAKEN: With all in favor, the motion passed.

5. INFORMATION / DISCUSSION ITEMS:

5.1 Opt In Public Opinion Research Panel

Ms. Patty Unfred of Metro briefed the committee on the Opt-in program. Program objectives include citizen outreach, communication, improved demographic representation for underserved populations, sustained citizen relationships, and increased transparency. Project partners include United Way of the Columbia Willamette, Northwest Health, and Portland State University. Committee discussion included internet access, language options, and other barriers.

5.2 Unified Planning Work Program

Mr. Josh Naramore of Metro briefed the committee on the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The UPWP include descriptions of all federally funded transportation planning activities to be undertaken by Metro, local governments and transportation agencies in the metropolitan region during the next fiscal year. Committee discussed the importance of the UPWP including encouragement from committee members to reconvene the project group. The committee also asked for further definition of the listed projects including the added Tiger 2 grant project. TPAC is scheduled to discuss and make a recommendation to JPACT at their March 15th meeting.

5.3 Regional Flexible Funds (RFF) Allocation

5.3.1 Resolution No. 11-4231, For the Purpose of Adopting the Recommendations of the Regional Flexible Funds Task Force

Mr. Ted Leybold and Ms. Amy Rose of Metro briefed the committee on Resolution No. 11-4231 which if approved would adopt the Regional Flexible Funds task force report. Committee discussion included supporting projects that provide mutual or common benefits for both freight and active transportation projects. TPAC recommended JPACT approve Resolution No. 11-4231 and identified the following Task Force recommendations as warranting further JPACT consideration:

- Elevating "Ability to leverage funds" to a higher priority criterion than "Low."
- In the Green Economy & Freight Initiatives category, whether the criteria for improving safety be broadly defined and not focused narrowly on removing conflicts with active transportation.
- In the Active Transportation & Complete Streets category, clarify that "separating" pedestrian/bike traffic from freight and/or vehicular conflicts to improve safety can include many types and designs of facilities (cycle-tracks or bike lanes), not just new facilities on separate right-of-way.
- Whether utilizing funding in the Green Economy & Freight Initiatives category for regional strategy and policy development is an appropriate use of these funds.

5.3.2 Resolution No. 11-4232, For the Purpose of Endorsing Procedures for the Allocation of 2014-15 Regional Flexible Funds to Individual Projects

Mr. Leybold and Ms. Rose briefed the committee on Resolution No. 11-4232, the companion piece to the task force report which outlines project development and the selection process. The Regional Flexible Funds Task Force was charged with developing a recommendation to JPACT on the priorities and implementation strategies for investing Regional Flexible Funds in the active transportation/complete streets and green economy/freight initiatives. Staff will facilitate a collaborative project nomination and evaluation process using those priorities and strategies to recommend projects for funding.

MOTION: Mr. Lehto moved, Ms. Tracy Ann Whalen seconded, to amend the Resolution No. 11-4232 to:

- Remove the word "the" from page one of Exhibit A.
- Add "lead agency presentation of project nominations to Task Force and TPAC for comment" under "Project nomination and assessment material" bullet
- Add the word "county" before coordinating committees for clarification under "Project Nomination bullet.

Add "local/sub-regional public process to aid in identification of projects to nominate" to "Project nomination and assessment material" bullet.

<u>DISCUSSION:</u> Committee discussed the recommendation process including the number of projects and the level of detail utilized. Some committee members expressed concern that public participation is not weighted as heavily as the task force even though decision-makers will receive an assessment regarding the process. Others noted that the task force was comprised of all citizen members, that it was a proper construct to obtain a complex citizen-based recommendation and that broad-based public input will still be solicited during the sub-regional narrowing process and during the regional comment process.

ACTION TAKEN: With all in favor the motion passed.

5.4 Active Transportation Demonstration Projects Criteria and Evaluation

Due to time constraints this item was postponed to the TPAC meeting scheduled for February 25, 2011.
