FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

Beginning in late March, the Zoo will be offering on-grounds shows involving live animal demonstrations to the public. This will increase the number of demonstrations that the Education Division conducts. Additional help is needed to present these shows and to handle and train the animals.

The addition of this position is being requested to meet the above-referenced need. The funds for this position are available in the current FY 1985-86 Zoo Personal Services budget in the temporary salary account. The transfer of money from the temporary services category to the position line item can be made administratively and does not require Council approval. This action is to request Council approval to add one position to the Zoo Educational Services Division.

This position was originally going to be proposed for the FY 1986-87 budget. However, the request is made for the FY 1985-86 budget so the person can be hired and trained for the current summer season which begins in June. Attached is a New Position/Reclass Request form originally prepared for the FY 1986-87 budget. The Program Assistant 1 position is at a salary range of 4.5 which, per the current Pay Play, is compensated at the range from \$14,373 to \$18,054 per year.

Under the Metro Code, Section 2.02.125, the Council must approve any positions added to the budget.

for daily performance during the summer require two staff persons for their operation. This position in combination with the existing Coordinator's position and a summer temporary assistant make it possible to conduct these shows seven days a week. Without this position, such programming would be restricted to five days a week. A similar situation exists during the remainder of the year for school assemblies and community event performances. In the absence of this position, all animal demonstration programming would be limited to a five day a week schedule and it would still be necessary to hire a part time position to cover the Coordinator's

Randy Boose reported Zoo staff had requested this budget adjustment in order to provide for more coverage of live animal demonstrations and traveling animal exhibits. FY 1985-86 funds previously budgeted for temporary staff could be transferred to the new position. He explained staff were requesting the change at this time in order to have a person hired by the start of the summer season. Funds for next fiscal year would be requested as part of the FY 1986-87 budget process.

Councilor Kelley asked Kay Rich whether the Zoo-To-You Program was being discontinued. Mr. Rich said the summer parks program would be replaced by the live animal demonstrations and traveling exhibits. The September to May Zoo-To-You programs for schools and nursing homes would continue.

Councilor Kafoury moved for adoption of Resolution Motion: No. 86-634 and Councilor Kirkpatrick seconded the motion.

Councilor Kirkpatrick requested the Program Assistant 1 position appear as a new position in the FY 1986-87 budget.
