BACKGROUND

The Metro Committee for Citizen Involvement (MCCI) has continued to attempt to fill its vacancies. MCCI has actively recruited new members, including soliciting stakeholders and local leaders for nominees, notifying agency staff, and advertising on a weekly basis.

Dresden Skees Gregory lives in District 4. The MCCI Membership Committee has recommended Ms. Gregory for this District 4 position citing her interest in land use planning and natural resources as well as her volunteer and community projects, including the Fairview Creek Watershed Council, OSU Extension Master Watershed Stewardship and Master Recycling programs, National Wildlife Federation Habitat Stewardship, and work with the Northwest Earth Institute as a discussion mentor.
