 - a. Receive regular information from the Executive Officer and Zoo staff on the update of the Zoo Master Plan, the acquarium feasibility study, Zoo tax levy proposal, the giant panda exhibit and any other item appropriate for review.
 - b. Make recommendations to the Council on all items listed which merit Council consideration and approval including those requiring Council approval under the Metropolitan Service District Code.
- 3. That the Committee shall terminate on completion of the items listed above or at any time deemed appropriate by the Council.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

The purpose of these Resolutions is to provide an organized structure for the Council to carry out its policy making and oversight responsibilities in the coming months. The proposed committees reflect the major functional responsibilities of the District. Each Resolution provides for the committee membership and purpose. The Resolutions include a termination clause. However, based on the outlined purposes, the Convention Center and Solid Waste committees will be active for several years.

The Resolutions have been reviewed by the proposed Committee Chairmen and the appropriate Department Heads.

3. EXECUTIVE OFFICER COMMUNICATIONS

Donald Carlson, Deputy Executive Officer, presented the Executive Officer's report in his absence.

Hazardous Waste Collection Days. Randi Wexler, Solid Waste Analyst, reviewed highlights of two special days organized by staff to collect household hazardous waste. She explained the pilot program was established as part of the Solid Waste Reduction Program. The
