- Metro Code 2.04 establishes the agency's program for providing contract opportunities to minority, women and emerging small businesses (MWESB).
- The Code also requires an annual report to the Metro Council on the utilization of MWESB contractors.

OPTIONS AVAILABLE

- Review the participation of MWESB contractors in Metro's procurement process.
- Inquire as to the effectiveness of the Code changes and contract recommendations by the Metro Council during the past year.

IMPLICATIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

- Changes to Metro's MWESB Contracting Code seem to have had an impact on small business participation during the past year.
- For the first time, Metro has achieved double digit utilization in consecutive years.



Metro MWESB Program

- Governed by Metro Code 2.04
- Established by Metro Council in response to Oregon Regional Disparity Study
- Historical patterns of exclusion of MWESBs brought about need for program
- Recent disparity studies by other agencies support the continuance of program

Metro MWESB Program

- Operated by FRS on behalf of the COO
- Focuses on outreach and opportunity
- Diversifying spend through technical assistance, project packaging, and education
- Contracts not "given", but earned by MWESB's through competition
- No hard goals involved

Metro MWESB Program


• All purchases \$5,000 - \$50,000

- Contact one MBE, WBE, and ESB
- Construction contracts \$5,000 \$50,000
 - Bid only among MWESB's
- Construction contracts over \$100,000
 - Good faith effort required of prime bidders
- Contracts over \$100,000
 - Advertised in minority publication

Utilization of MWESB's

- 86 out of 364 contracts went to MWESB contractors (24%)
- Contract awards to MWESB's totaled \$3,175,595 (11%)

MBE, WBE, ESB Breakdown





Departmental Highlights

- **Communications** awarded \$243,000 to MWESB's through flex services contracts
- **OMA** awarded \$100,000 to MWESB firms
- MWESB contract awards from **PES** reached \$857,965
- **Planning** has MWESB utilization rate of 7%
- Sustainability Center achieved 50% in utilization, largely through vegetation maintenance contracts


Utilization History



FOTA Participation at MERC Venues

- 24 out of 162 available contracts awarded to businesses within FOTA (15%)
- Contract awards to FOTA businesses totaled \$247, 469 (5%)
- 25 contracts awarded to MWESB's in fiscal year 2010-11
- MWESB contract awards totaled \$251,457 (5%)

MBE, WBE, ESB Breakdown for MERC Contracts




FOTA Participation at MERC Venues

- First opportunity target area provides contract opportunities for economically disadvantaged businesses
- Oregon Convention Center, Portland Expo, Portland Center for the Performing Arts
- Applies to contracts between \$5,000 and \$100,000

- \$247,469 in contracts awarded to FOTA businesses (5%)
- 24 out 162 contracts (15%)





MWESB Utilization at MERC Venues


- Total of **\$251,457** in contracts went to MWESB firms (5%)

MWESB Breakdown




Hoyt Street Station Community Café Project

- Acted as our own general contractor
- Packaged work to maximize MWESB usage
- 9 out of 13 contracts went to MWESB's
 Contracts to MWESB's totaled \$74,399 (48%)

Veterinary Medical Center

- Listed aspirational goal of **15%** in RFB
- Selected Skanska through 2 step bid process
- Utilization of MWESB subcontractors at 17%
- **\$712,147** in contracts went to MWESB subcontractors

Turner School of Construction Management

- April 2011 partnered with Turner Construction for the 45th annual school of construction management
- MWESBs trained on estimating, project management, subcontracting, etc.
- 35 contractors graduated in 2011

Status on Council Recommendations

- Prime contractor reporting requirements have been increased
- Projects better packaged for sheltered market
- Diversity included as an evaluation criteria
- □ MWESB training provided to agency

- Increased networking with MWESB contractors
- Ongoing engagement of Metro Attorney
- MWESBs contacted electronically
- Employee compensation included in RFP selection criteria
