December 7, 2011

Welcome

Committee chair Linda Craig welcomed the committee and thanked them for attending.

Program updates

Acquisition, capital grants and local share

Kathleen Brennan-Hunter said there have been three acquisitions since the last committee meeting – one along Baker Creek in the Lower Tualatin River target area; a trail easement along Northeast Marine Drive; and 42 acres in the Rock Creek target area called Orenco Woods. She indicated several more are under contract and should close within the next several months. David Pollock questioned why the City of Gresham's commitment to build the trail was 3 to 6 years away. Kathleen explained that for some trails, the gaps have all been filled and are ready to build, and the jurisdiction has the money to do so. In other cases, the jurisdiction will complete the trail once adjacent gaps are filled, which is the case with this section of the Marine Drive Trail. Linda Craig noted that access at Orenco Woods was only rated as medium, and wondered if it would be rated "high" in the future. Kathleen said while there is no public access at this time, eventually the site will be a nature park. She noted that there is a MAX light rail station just west of the property. The dashboard and acquisition report are attached.

Kathleen said that the negotiators continue to discuss opportunities in the target areas where there have been few or no acquisitions. They have reviewed strategies and contacted landowners in those target areas. She said this review will be ongoing.

The deadline to submit full capital grant applications is in January. Kathleen indicated there will likely be 6-7 applications to consider. She said it was about a four month process for the capital grants review committee to review the applications and present them to the Metro Council for approval, and suggested inviting members of the capital grants review committee to the April Oversight Committee meeting to discuss the process and the current applications. Steve Yarosh, who is also a member of the grant review committee, said members engage in vigorous discussions about the applications and also go on site visits and often meet with applicants on site to discuss their projects. He invited Oversight Committee members to attend a meeting to learn more about the process. Heather Kent said the next meeting will be 10:30 a.m. to noon on Friday, Jan. 13. This meeting will be an opportunity to introduce new committee members, reflect on the program's progress to date and determine if any refinements to the process are needed before starting the next cycle. Linda asked to be included on the invitation list.

Kathleen announced that the cities of Portland and Rivergrove have made incremental progress in their local share projects; she had no other local share progress to report at this time.

Financial report

Brian Kennedy noted that, because of the way Metro's accounting cycles line up, the financial report (attached) is as of October 31, and there were few changes since the last meeting. Linda inquired about the direct admin staff costs, which seem to be substantially different that those reported at the last meeting. Brian said it may be a data entry error and will send an email to the committee with the correct information. He said Metro is still planning a small bond sale in late spring or summer to ensure the program has the resources to continue without interruption.

Natural Areas Information System database

Brian gave a short presentation on the new database, which will improve workflow, create a central depository for information (staff currently use more than 50 databases to track information) and support ongoing management of acquisitions. Linda asked whether the database with help with tracking how the region's ecological health is improving. Brian said that really isn't in the scope of the program, but the database will help staff track and monitor the progress of each property, and eventually the database will be linked to Metro's GIS database. Councilor Harrington asked if the database will interact with the biodiversity atlas. Kathleen said that the Regional Conservation Strategy will be a high level strategy and management actions on specific sites will be linked to habitat outcomes. Kendra Smith suggested that eventually the database may be able to interact with other databases, such as the one the watershed councils are beginning to use. David Pollock suggested investigating whether the system should be open sourced or sold to other government agencies – it could be a potential source of revenue as well as leadership. Linda asked if the performance measurement charts currently in use will be found in the new system. Kathleen said performance measures will be included. Brian said he expects Phase I to be complete in May 2012.

Stabilization

Kate Holleran and Jeff Merrill discussed the new function-based stabilization guidelines, which they are beginning to apply to Metro properties. Kate said the new guidelines have driven staff to develop new benchmarks. Jim Desmond thanked the committee for their help in developing the new guidelines. Linda thanked Jeff and Kate and said she hoped they would return in 6-12 months for another update on how the new guidelines are working.

Natural areas tours

Kathleen said staff is arranging a series of tours for the committee. The tours will be held 8:30 a.m to noon, on Jan. 20, Jan. 26 and Feb. 9. Tour sites include the Columbia Slough/Marine Drive Trail, which includes both natural areas and trails; Deep Creek, including portions of the Cazadero Trail; and Upper Rock Creek near the top of the watershed close to Northwest Skyline Blvd., where there have been several recent acquisitions. Kathleen will send an email to committee members with more information. She noted that while members of the Oversight Committee are the primary audience, invitations will also be extended to members of the Metro Council and several key internal staff. Councilor Harrington suggested inviting the Executive Council on Active Transportation.

Council update

Councilor Harrington discussed the Metro Council's suggestions for the committee to consider as it formulates its work plan (see Nov. 29, 2011 letter, attached).

Oversight Committee work plan

Linda said the draft work plan is based on the committee's "year ahead" section in the annual report, plus suggestions from council. She would like to discuss performance measures pertaining to the local share program and how the acquisition performance measures may be rolled together to give an overview of all of the acquisitions combined. She asked Kathleen to present another target area update at the February meeting. She suggested discussing cumulative results of performance measures per target area, as well as an ecological overview at the April meeting. Norm Penner said voters may like to know how the properties acquired to date will provide economic benefit to their communities, and suggested addressing this issue in the committee's next report. Linda, David Pollock and Christine Dupres will meet with staff in early January to discuss performance measures. If anyone else is interested in joining this subcommittee please contact Linda or Marybeth Haliski. The draft work plan is attached.

Metro's portfolio of natural areas, parks and trails: opportunities and challenges

Jim Desmond discussed the report, which was presented at the Metro Council's Nov. 22 meeting. The report details Metro's portfolio of land and outlines possibilities for restoring, maintaining and publicly opening these sites in the future. Jim said the report was written by staff in response to a request by the Council. Many staff participated in the project. For example, the chapter on restoration and land management was written by members of the science team. Kay Hutchinson commented that she hadn't realized Metro owned and operated such a wide range of properties until she read the report. Linda asked whether the type of property – nature park, natural area or habitat preserve – could be added to the closing memos or performance measurement charts. Discussion of the pros and cons for doing this followed.

Next meeting

The next meeting will be in early February. As usual, staff will send a poll after the first of the year for members to determine their availability.








Local Share program

Dear Linda,

Thank you for your multiple years of service on the Natural Areas Program Performance Oversight Committee and for your leadership in serving as the chair of the committee this last year. The Metro Council is very appreciative of the service that each member of the oversight committee provides and would appreciate your conveying the thanks of the entire Council to the committee for their hard work and commitment. The attention of the oversight committee has assured that the business practices and acquisition methods used by our staff at Metro meet the highest standards. This program is critical to the health and economy of the Portland metropolitan region for current and future generations, and your passion and professional discipline helps us fulfill our fiduciary responsibility with this important land conservation measure.

The committee is authorized to ask any questions or analyze any aspect of the bond program it believe warrants investigation. The Metro Council appreciates the scope of the committee's examination of the program and its consideration of incorporating feedback from the Council in prior years. The Council has had the opportunity to read your September 2011 report in detail and with this letter respectfully offers some thoughts and additional items for potential future consideration.

The September 2011 report describes various subjects for your work plan for the 2011-2012 year. The subjects in the work plan are also of particular interest to us, and we invite your consideration of our questions and comments in the following areas:

Looking ahead: In a few years the bond measure program will be 10 years old. Are there some performance aspects that we should be monitoring now that will help ensure successful achievement by 2016? With the bond measure having three major aspects (regional acquisitions, local share, capital grants) are there any operational or performance aspects that we should be taking into account now so that we have a solid story to share with our regional residents in 5 years? You addressed this question in the September report with respect to regional acquisitions; could you address it also for the local share and capital grant parts of the program?

Progress regionally: Acquisitions within the 20 target and 7 trail/greenway areas have been proceeding following the bond program refinement plans and principles (e.g. willing seller.) The Council appreciates the level of information that the committee has been following and probing in executing its responsibility to the region. Like you, we are wondering how progress on these specific areas adds up cumulatively for the benefit of clean air, water and natural habitat for the region, and more specifically if there is anything that Metro should consider as it completes the program so that the program is not only successful with each individual area but also that the cumulative set provides a holistic result for the benefit of future generations?

Local Share Progress and Regional assessment: We know that you are planning an evaluation of the local share projects as part of your work plan. We would like to know how you think these local share projects are helping to achieve the regionally adopted 6 desired outcomes of a successful region. How have the local share projects helped to cumulatively achieve a regional result, for example access to parks?

Site Stabilization Timing: We appreciate the committee's attention in reviewing the approach that Metro staff has been taking on site stabilization after property acquisition. Given the seasonal aspect of nature and stabilization activities (ex. cutting seasons and planting seasons) we are wondering if specific seasonal dates were considered for starting a site stabilization clock independent of the specific acquisition date? This might provide enough time for staff to execute a best practice for the site specific inventory walk-through surveys needed, as well as time to construct a site specific stabilization plan including setting up the work crews, none of which can be done until an acquisition has actually closed, and all of which must be done in relation to nature's four seasons. Perhaps your review of site stabilization included such an idea, but if not, please feel free to let us know, as it may be appropriate for the Council to adopt a modified approach for authorized use of bond measure funds for these vital stabilization activities than was originally envisioned and defined.

In addition to these suggestions for the work plan you have already outlined, the Council is pondering some other subjects on which we would appreciate your guidance in this or future years.

Trails and Natural Areas: All of the natural area acquisitions are proximate to our metropolitan population. In some areas, people are creating unauthorized trails. In addition, the region has taken deliberate policy and investment actions with an Active Transportation program. Some habitat areas are quite sensitive, others less so. What criteria might you suggest Metro consider using to enable more trail presence along the edge of or through natural areas so that we can be successful in balancing the needs for human health and access to nature while also preserving natural areas?

Review of Collection with Health, Equity and Tourism perspectives: The acquisition and preservation of natural areas with this bond program are being done to safeguard water quality, protect fish and wildlife habitat and ensure access to nature for future generations. Since then the Metro region has adopted 6 desired outcomes for a successful region. In the full scope of its work, the Metro Council is increasingly reviewing programs with health and equity lenses as well as taking stock of the contribution that tourism makes to our regional and state economy. Your committee offers a valuable perspective to the region and to the Metro Council, so we want to ensure that you have the opportunity to provide us with your perspective. As with all aspects of the Natural Areas Bond Program, we would expect that Metro staff would help frame information for your consideration. Given the increased emphasis that Health, Equity and

Tourism aspects are taking in our region, as the Metro Council considers access to these properties for future generations, what are your thoughts on these three aspects and the properties that make up the regional collection? How would you tell the story of the Natural Areas program for each of these three aspects?

The range of items above reflect the level of respect and appreciation that the Metro Council has for the expertise and opinions of the oversight committee. It also provides some insight into the curiosity that the Metro Council has about the value these bond investments will have for future generations. The Council would appreciate your consideration of our thoughts, but are in no way intending to divert you from your chosen course. We are mindful that the oversight committee has a full complement of work before it in the year ahead. I look forward to your next meeting, and the finalization of your committee work plan, which will lead to another valuable report next year. Thank you again for your service and attention to detail, which helps to ensure our agency ever improves its performance.
