#### **DESCRIPTION**

The Lead Litter Patrol staff picks up litter on guest pathways and other areas of the zoo and collects trash and recyclables to ensure a clean environment for zoo guests. Also responsible for providing training and general work direction to the Litter Patrol staff.

#### **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

Tasks listed are intended to be descriptive and not restrictive. An employee in this classification may perform any of the tasks listed; however, these examples do not include all the tasks which an employee may be expected to perform.

- 1. Picks up litter and ensures the zoo grounds are clean and orderly.
- 2. Provides training and general work direction to Litter Patrol staff as assigned by supervisor.
- 3. Submits draft schedules to custodial manager for approval.
- 4. Completes and posts daily assignment sheets. Ensures staff breaks and lunches are taken in a timely manner.
- 5. Determines inventory needs and communicates with custodial manager.
- 6. Assists with implementing Visitor Services rules are followed by staff, including uniform and other zoo regulations.
- 7. Collects recycling and trash outdoors and inside buildings.
- 8. Provides directions and other general assistance to the public.
- 9. Alerts supervisor or other staff as appropriate to any problem needing attention.
- 10. Fulfills Metro's employee values of Public Service, Excellence, Teamwork, Respect, Innovation, and Sustainability. These duties include but are not limited to:
  - a. Maintaining positive relationships;
  - b. Respecting diversity of ideas and perspectives of others;
  - c. Demonstrating sustainable practices;
  - d. Assisting the public, public officials and other employees in a professional and courteous manner;
  - e. Developing safe work habits and contributing to the safety of self and co-workers;
  - f. Contributing to a positive team atmosphere; and
  - g. Having regular and punctual attendance.
- 11. Perform assigned duties during an emergency situation.
- 12. Other duties as assigned.

### DISTINGUISHING FEATURES

This is the lead level in the Litter Patrol series. It is distinguished from the Litter Patrol classification by providing training and general work direction to Litter Patrol staff.
