WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Service District is responsible for disposing of solid waste in the region, developing and operating the Washington Park Zoo, developing and operating the Oregon Convention Center, administering the metropolitan Urban Growth Boundary, regional transportation planning and planning for the provision of other services on a regional basis; and

whereas, The Metropolitan Service District is presently engaged in several major efforts including: implementation of the Zoo Master Plan; update of the Solid Waste Management Plan and procurement of solid waste disposal facilities; construction of the Oregon Convention Center; start-up of the Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission to operate the convention center and implement the CTS Master Plan; the periodic update of the metropolitan Urban Growth Boundary; development of a regional transportation financing plan; a review of the organization, authority and functions of the District by the Interim Task Force on Regional Government; and investigation of the need for a tax base for the District; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Metropolitan Service District, in order to exercise its policy-making and oversight responsibilities in an efficient and effective manner, finds that it is necessary to reorganize itself into seven standing committees; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED,

- 1. That the following Council standing committees are created: Convention Center, Finance, Intergovernmental Relations, Internal Affairs, Planning and Development, Solid Waste and Zoo.
- 2. That the purpose of each committee shall be as described in Exhibit A and the membership of each committee for calendar year 1988 shall be as described in Exhibit B attached hereto.
- 3. That the Council Management Committee created by Resolution No. 84-482 is abolished and its responsibilities delegated to the new standing committees as described in Exhibit A attached hereto.
- 4. That the "purposes" for (1) the Solid Waste Committee as stated in Resolution No. 86-705; (2) the Zoo Planning Committee as stated in Resolution No. 86-706; and (3) the Convention Center Committee as stated in Resolution No. 86-704, are rescinded and replaced by the "purposes" described in Exhibit A attached hereto.

EXHIBIT A

PURPOSE OF COUNCIL STANDING COMMITTEES

CONVENTION CENTER COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Convention Center Committee shall be to:

- review and make recommendations to the Council on policies and programs relating to the development and operation of the Oregon Convention Center;
- 2. oversee the work of the Convention Center Project office to assure that program goals and objectives are met;
- 3. review and make recommendations to the Council on confirmation of Executive Officer appointments to the Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission, appropriate positions, and committees relating to the development and operation of convention, trade and spectator facilities;
- 4. review and make recommendations to the Council on other matters referred to the Committee by the Presiding Officer; and
- 5. act as a liaison with the Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission, the Advisory Committee on Design and Construction, or other related committees which may be created.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Finance Committee shall be to:

- act as the annual Budget Committee (augmented with citizens) to review and make recommendations to the Council on the District's fiscal year budget and appropriations schedule;
- review and make recommendations to the Council on periodic budget and appropriation requests by departments of the District;
- 3. review and make recommendations to the Council on the annual financial audit and investment policies and practices of the District;
- 4. review and make recommendations to the Council on revenue proposals of the District including tax base measures, special property tax measures, bond issues, service charges and fees, etc.;

- 5. To review and make recommendations to the Council on long-range financial plans and policies of the District; and
- 6. review and make recommendations to the Council on audits of the various functions of the District, including a review of the need for management and performance auditing.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Intergovernmental Relations Committee shall be to:

- 1. review and make recommendations to the Council on existing programs relating to transportation and land use planning, Urban Growth Boundary management, economic development, data services, merger of the District with existing regional agencies, and other matters relating to the District and other local governments;
- oversee the work of the Transportation Department and the Research & Development Department to assure that program goals and objectives are met;
- 3. coordinate the nomination of Boundary Commission members by Metro Councilors and to review and make recommendations to the Council on Executive Officer appointments to appropriate positions and committees relating to the purpose of the Intergovernmental Relations Committee.
- 4. review and recommend to the Council on other matters referred to the Committee by the Presiding Officer; and
- 5. act as a liaison with the Joint Advisory Committee on Transportation, the Boundary Commission, and other committees or commissions which may be created.

INTERNAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Internal Affairs Committee is to:

- 1. coordinate the work of standing committees of the Council;
- 2. review and make recommendations to the Council on internal operational matters of the District including the personnel and contract rules, Disadvantaged Business Program policies and programs, etc.;
- 3. oversee the work of the Council Executive Management, Finance & Administration, Public Affairs and Office of General Counsel to assure that program goals and objectives are met;

- 4. review and make recommendations to the Council on all Executive Officer appointments to appropriate positions and committees not covered by other committees;
- 5. assume the responsibilities of the Management Committee not otherwise assigned to another standing committee including approval of contracts and contract amendments required by Metro Code Chapter 2.04 and the administration of the "Guidelines for Council Expenditures" set forth in Resolution No. 85-541;
- 6. review and make recommendations to the Council on other matters referred the Committee by the Presiding Officer; and
- 7. act as a personnel committee of the Council to employ, evaluate and terminate Council staff.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Planning and Development Committee shall be to:

- 1. review and make recommendations to the Council on the development of plans to assume additional functions as authorized in ORS ch. 268;
- 2. act as a liaison with the Interim Task Force on Metropolitan Regional Government, and review and make recommendations to the Council on proposals brought to the Task Force or developed by the Task Force;
- in cooperation with the Finance Committee, review and make recommendations to the Council on the submission of a tax base measure to the voters in November 1988; and
- 4. review and recommend to the Council on other matters referred to the Committee by the Presiding Officer.

SOLID WASTE COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Solid Waste Committee shall be to:

- 1. review and make recommendations to the Council on policies and programs relating to the solid waste disposal responsibilities of the District;
- 2. oversee the work of the Solid Waste Department to assure that program goals and objectives are met;

- 3. review and recommend confirmation of Executive Officer appointments to committees and appropriate positions relating to the development and operation of the solid waste disposal system;
- 4. review and recommend to the Council on other matters referred to the Committee by the Presiding Officer; and
- 5. act as a liaison with the Solid Waste Management Plan Policy and Technical Committees or other solid waste advisory committees which may be created.

ZOO COMMITTEE

The purpose of the Zoo Committee shall be to:

- 1. review and make recommendations to the Council on policies and programs relating to the Washington Park Zoo;
- 2. oversee the work of the Zoo Department to assure that program goals and objectives are met;
- 3. review and recommend confirmation of Executive Officer appointments to committees and appropriate positions relating to the development and operation of the Zoo;
- 4. review and make recommendations to the Council on other matters referred to the Committee by the Presiding Officer; and
- 5. act as a liaison with the Friends of the Washington Park Zoo or other Zoo-related committees which may be created.

COUNCIL ORGANIZATION FOR 1988

RESOLUTION NO. 88-840

The purpose of this resolution is to present an organization plan for the Council which will improve effectiveness in policy making and ensure that District policies and programs are carried out by the Executive Officer and staff. Committee organization and assignments are set forth in Resolution No. 88-840 which is attached.

The ideas included in this reorganization have been discussed by various Councilors for the past several months as we have been confronted by the change in the relationship with the Executive Officer. The main emphasis of this reorganization is to focus the work of the Council in committees. This will increase our collective ability to become more deeply involved in the policy matters of this District. Good functioning committees will enable us to become more specialized in the various complex matters that this government handles.

Resolution No. 88-840 creates the following standing committees: Convention Center, Finance, Intergovernmental Relations, Internal Affairs, Planning and Development, Solid Waste and Zoo. It provides for policy-making and oversight for all departments and functions of the District. It also provides a mechanism for the Council to address matters that we heretofore have not taken up. For instance, we need to address the future of the agency in regard to the opportunities to assume additional functions or merge with existing regional bodies. These issues are currently being discussed by the Interim Task Force on Metropolitan Government. This plan provides a mechanism for the Council to "get ahead" of the work of the Task Force and make proposals to that body as well as respond to ideas which are brought forward from other places.

A key part of this plan is that all matters coming to the Council (ordinances, resolutions, executive appointments, etc.) will have been reviewed and recommended by a committee. This should enable the Council to more thoroughly consider all aspects of matters brought before it.

Council's proper procedures. He was disappointed the Committee had shut off debate and thought a disservice had been done to the public. He explained that the public attending the meeting were there to influence the Council and they should have been given that opportunity.

Presiding Officer Ragsdale requested the Executive Officer or Solid Waste staff respond to questions raised by the Oregon Fair Share organization as soon as possible.

The Presiding Officer called a recess at 6:25 p.m. The meeting reconvened at 6:40 p.m.

6. COUNCILOR COMMUNICATIONS

Acknowlgement of Councilor Waker's Contributions as Past Presiding Officer of the Council. Presiding Officer Ragsdale presented a plaque of appreciation to Councilor Waker and recognized the Councilor's many contributions to Metro during his 1986 and 1987 terms as Presiding Officer including: JPACT Chair, Convention Center Advisory Committee on Design and Construction, Convention Center Committee, Ad Hoc Task Force on establishing policies relating to the Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission, and the Legislative Committee. He recommended Councilor Waker continue to serve as Chairman of the Joint Policy Advisory Committee on Transportation (JPACT).

6.1 Consideration of Resolution No. 87-840, for the Purpose of Creating Council Standing Committees

Presiding Officer Ragsdale explained the purpose of the resolution was to organize the Council as a legislative body. All issues would first be presented to one of seven standing committees. The new committee structure would require amendments to the Council's procedures and an ordinance to amend procedures would be presented to the Council as soon as possible. The resolution included a list of Council committee assignments he explained was open for review. Other committee assignments would be evaluated and discussed at a later date.

Motion: Councilor Knowles moved, seconded by Councilor DeJardin, to adopt Resolution No. 88-840.

Councilor Waker said he wished to continue to serve on the Council Convention Center Committee.

A discussion followed about the proposed reorganization. Councilor Kirkpatrick noted that seven members would serve on the Solid Waste and Internal Affairs committees. She questioned whether problems

would result because a minority of the Council could no longer have influence on certain issues. Presiding Officer Ragsdale requested Councilors first work with the new structure and make changes later if problems resulted.

Responding to Councilor Van Bergen's questions, Presiding Officer Ragsdale said he would soon make recommendations to address needs for increased staffing of Council committees. He also explained that new rules for Council organization would require the Council to ratify committee structure on an annual basis. This would allow for a review of the structure, he explained.

Councilor Kirkpatrick reported she was Chair of a three-member task force charged to review Council staffing needs. The Task Force would soon report its recommendations to the Council.

Councilor Kirkpatrtick and Hansen noted the Council had gone through other reorganizations and the key to making any system work was good communication.

<u>Vote:</u> A vote on the motion to adopt the resolution resulted in all twelve Councilors voting aye.

The motion carried and Resolution No. 88-840 was unanimously adopted.

7. EXECUTIVE OFFICER COMMUNICATIONS

Executive Officer Cusma congratulated Presiding Officer Ragsdale regarding his new office and the Council's reorganization. She also thanked Councilor Waker for his assistance during her first year in office.

7.1 Consideration of Resolution No. 88-841, for the Purpose of Confirming the Appointment of Y. Sherry Sheng to the Position of Director, Washington Park Zoo

Executive Officer Cusma introduced Ms. Sheng to the Council, announcing she was very pleased to recommended such a highly credentialed, well educated and exceptional candidate.

Councilor Kirkpatrick, Chair of the Zoo Committee, reported the Committee was pleased to unanimously recommended Ms. Sheng's confirmation. She also acknowledged the Committee had concerns about the Council's involvement in future appointments to key staff positions and she was confident those concerns would be worked out.

Motion: Councilor Kirkpatrick moved, seconded by Councilor Bonner, to adopt Resolution No. 88-841.
