Consideration of Awards for Visitor Services Food Contracts

Date: January 19, 1988

In response to the requirement for more formalized purchase procedures for food products for resale- the Visitors Services Division developed a bid package for all foodstuffs and related items. Product specifications, developed with the assistance of John Cornyn and Associates, were categorized by Grocery items, Meat, Fish, and Poultry, Bakery I & II, Dairy I & II, Produce, Coffee, Paper supplies, and Popcorn and miscellaneous. Taste tests for several items were required as part of the bid process. Awards are based on the lowest bidder that passed the taste test. In some cases maintenance of existing equipment was also required as part of the product bid price.

An invitation to bid for Foodstuffs and related items was advertised in the Daily Journal of Commerce and the Scanner on November 6, 1987. 21 Responses were received from vendors; some vendors bid on more than one category. The total response by category was: Bakery I - 1 bidder; Bakery II: Chocolate chip cookies - 1 bidder; Grocery - 2 bidders; Meat, Fish, & Poultry - 4 bidders; Dairy I & II: 3 bidders each; Paper - 4 bidders; Popcorn & Misc.- 3 bidders.

Awards for products were determined based upon responsiveness, low bid, and taste test where applicable. The following awards are recommended:

No responsive bids were received for Popcorn items, Fruit whip, or Cone Mix. For each of these items, product compatibility with the existing machines and vendor maintenance of the equipment included in the bid price was required. Based on the lack of bids and the uniqueness of these items we believe a sole source bid award is justified. The current vendors of these items were called for phone quotes. The following sole source awards are recommended:

The term of the awards will be for one year. Two of the vendors total awards exceeded \$50,000 and will be presented to the Council. The remaining items awarded fell well below the \$10,000 mark.

Individual 10. oz cartons of Grade A pasteurized, homogenized 2% fat content cow's milk fortified with vitamins A & D and flavored with real chocolate.

MILK, 2% WHITE

Individual 10 oz. cartons of Grade A pasteurized, homogenized 2% fat content cow's milk fortified with vitamins A & D.

YOGURT

8-oz. Individual pack containers of unsweetened yogurt with fruit added. No sugars or other sweeteners added.

ICE CREAM NOVELTY ITEM

A variety of ice cream novelties including a Fudgesicle, popsicle, and mint ice cream with wafer cookie (top and bottom) covered with chocolate.

JUICE, GRAPE

USDA frozen Grade A Fancy (minimum score 85) unsweetened, 14.1 minimum Brix/acid rate in individual portion containers of 6 oz.

JUICE, LEMON

USDA Grade A from concentrated, unsweetened lemon juice in 1-quart containers, purchased individually as needed.

LEMONADE

Dry concentrate lemonade in bulk containers and liquid concentrate in 24/16 oz. containers.
