# CONSIDERATION OF THE RESOLUTION NO. 97 2501 FOR THE PURPOSE OF APPOINTING MEMBERS OF THE REGIONAL NATURAL HAZARD TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

#### PROPOSED ACTION

This resolution will appoint members (Exhibit "A") of the Regional Natural Hazard Technical Advisory Committee (HAZTAC). The HAZTAC will assist Metro with addressing the metropolitan aspects of natural disaster planning and response coordination as stipulated in the Metro Charter.

#### **BACKGROUND AND FACTUAL ANALYSIS**

#### **Background**

On September 26, 1996, the Metro Council approved Resolution No. 96-2367 that created the Regional Natural Hazards Technical Advisory Committee (HAZTAC) to advise the Council and Metro's Policy Advisory Committee on measures local governments, businesses and citizens of this region can take to reduce damage from natural disaster. Recommendations of the HAZTAC will be delivered to the Executive Officer, Council and the Metro Policy Advisory Committee by the Director of the Growth Management Services Department and/or the chair of the advisory committee.

The creation of HAZTAC is an effort to consolidate existing ad hoc Metro committees working on different aspects of natural hazard planning issues. The establishment of HAZTAC would eliminate the need to create ad hoc committees in the future.

Council Resolution No. 96-2367 specified that the composition of HAZTAC, with 13 voting members and one ex-officio (non-voting) member appointed by the Council (see Attachment "A"). Resolution 96-2367 also specified that the Executive Officer shall send nominations to the Council for confirmation, and that the Presiding Officer shall appoint the ex-officio member who will be confirmed by the Council.

#### **Nomination Process**

Nominees were solicited through newspaper advertisements, Metro Committee for Citizen Involvement, notices to local governments and neighborhoods, community, business, and emergency management organizations. Press releases were sent to the local press. Applications were also sent to persons who served previously on the Natural Hazard Program's advisory committees such as the Metro Advisory Committee for Mitigating Earthquake Damage, Regional Emergency Transportation Routes Committee, Metro Area Disaster Information Atlas Committee, Peer Review Committee for Portland Pilot Earthquake Damage and Loss Results Study, and Earthquake Preparedness Conference Planning Committee.

The following criteria were used to select nominees:

- Education and Work Experience.
- Involvement with professional boards/associations/organizations, civic groups, etc.
- Service in the capacity of "liaison" for any professional groups, organization or association.
- Relevant experience, skills or interests that have prepared nominee for a position on the HAZTAC.
- Knowledge of the opportunities and challenges for a regional natural hazards mitigation program over the next two years.
- References familiar with the nominee's professional and volunteer work experiences.

A total of 23 individuals applied for a position on the HAZTAC (see Attachment "B"). There were no initial applicants from homebuilders or hospitals. Extensive outreach was conducted to get applicants from these two sectors. After additional outreach, one application was received from each of the following sectors: home builders, Port of Portland, general contractors, private utilities, hospital and attorneys. The positions for local governments, geologist, schools and non-profit emergency services representatives attracted more than one application each. Four applications were received from individuals whose profile did not fit into the positions approved by the Council. These applicants represent civil engineering, geotechnical and environmental groups.

Based on preliminary evaluation of the 23 applications by staff, the Executive Officer appointed a fourperson final nomination committee made up of the three top applicants and a Metro staff. The recommendations of the nomination committee was forwarded to the Executive Officer, resulting in the attached nomination.

#### **EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION**
