#### Dear Members of GPAC:

I want to extend my best wishes to all of you for a productive 2006 and I wish to thank you for your sincere work during 2005, particularly the task forces which concluded last summer. The vision for a regional system of parks and greenspaces that you have crafted is exciting. We would like you to now take the next tangible steps toward formulating how such a vision would be manifested in institutional and financial terms.

Two areas of your scope are particularly timely now, where I would like you to focus your efforts in 2006:

First, the institutional relationships. Today we have a patchwork of public lands, managed in a fragmented fashion. While we all respect local variations, and indeed want to enhance variation and innovation across the region, I think we all agree that more collaboration among providers would be mutually beneficial. We know, for example, that models in St. Louis and the Twin Cities may be worthy of emulation, just to cite two examples. In whatever format, my feeling is that new levels of institutional collaboration could improve our network and service to our citizens. I ask that in 2006 you work with parks and greenspaces providers and interested parties in the region to identify optimal variations of such collaboration. What system of institutional relationships will be required to support a more rational regional system of parks and greenspaces?

You should not hesitate to help us answer a related question to which I do not have a preordained answer: what is the proper role of the Metro Council, which now owns over
10,000 acres of land, and would acquire more if the ballot measure is successful? Should
the Metro Council continue to be a provider in one part of the region (Blue Lake and
Oxbow) but not in others? Or should Metro Council lands be managed by other
jurisdictions? Should the Metro Council provide technical services, and be a conduit for
regional funds, at least to those jurisdictions which are today providing *de facto* regional
parks without regional remuneration? These are samples of the questions you should
help us consider.

Secondly, finance. The Metro Council's recent population projections show 1.1 million more people in the region by 2030, a rate of growth that far exceeds the rate projected when we developed the region 2040 plan in the 1990s.

Maintaining and operating our parks, natural areas, trails and other important elements of our regional landscape is an important challenge as the population grows and we seek to maintain our quality of life. Funding levels are already inadequate, and the situation will worsen dramatically as we add more than a million new residents to the region. This

problem transcends individual jurisdictional boundaries. It is an issue in Gresham as it is in Forest Grove, as much a problem for Tigard as it is for Troutdale.

Accordingly, I ask that in 2006 you continue the work to quantify that need, particularly in the operations and maintenance area. Obviously, this work links to the first assignment I suggested, which pertains to proper institutional roles which may lead to the optimization of efficient service delivery. Better coordination and leveraging of existing resources, as well as identifying potential new sources of funds, may be parts of the answer.

Your 2005 vision task forces explored, preliminarily, some of these issues and laid a solid foundation for further work. Given the urgency of these challenges, it is my hope that you can forward recommendations on both of these issues to the Metro Council by the end of 2006.

I regret not being able to attend your January 26 meeting but look forward to seeing you another time soon. On behalf of the Metro Council, thank you for the work you are doing on these important issues.
