Annotated Summit Outline

OBJECTIVE: Engage a variety of people on the benefits of creating a seamless regional park system by examining the current system, celebrating the recent passage of the bond, exploring opportunities to acquiring funding to market a cohesive system. The event is to be used as a set-up to begin implementation by seeking a common legislative agenda, changing operating practices or agency responsibilities to maximize resources.

Venue: Adidas has tentatively committed to the use its facility

- Conference facility located on the top floor of the Red Building and has stadium type seating, great media capabilities and a reception area
- The reception area has a view of Forest Park and downtown
- Adidas has its own catering service that we can use for the event
- The site is located off of the yellow Max line

Number of attendees: maximum of 150 people

Breakout of attendees: 20-25 elected officials (local/state/federal), 15 tourism/chamber leaders, 30-35 key business leaders, 35 Park Directors and key staff, 20 advocates/non-profit, 15 GPAC members, remainder-staff

Date: the event can be held either May 9th or 11th (Wed or Friday)

Keynote Speakers:

Event kickoff: Richard Louv, Author of "Last Child in the Woods" (confirm) Lunchtime speaker: Tim Boyle, CEO of Columbia Sportswear (confirm) * At this point Mayor Daley is unlikely although when the date is firm we will contact his office again

Materials: Roll out GPAC's work to define the existing and proposed park system (Map Atlas, Master Plan Map and Natural Areas/Landscape Diversity Map), 50 walks brochure and the Regional Park Finder Web Tool.

Lead Off: Council President Bragdon will kick off the event with a brief discussion on the success of the 1995 bond measure and the recent success of passing a second bond measure in 2006. He will introduce guest speakers and may award \$\$\$ to a grant recipient as a demonstration of how this concept of working together can pay big dividends for individual organizations and assist in reaching overall goals.

Where are we now?

Jim Desmond will set the stage for the day by discussing the work that GPAC has completed to determine the status of the current park and natural systems in the region and where the gaps are in the planned system.

Themes for the Event: 3 Tracks or Themes

Based on the objective above three major themes have been identified. Speakers will be chosen to provide information on the theme and stimulate discussion on how our region could benefit from employing a regional concept to deliver park services. The themes or tracks may not provide all of the answers but should be used to start conversations and motivate park professionals, elected officials and business people to work together to achieve results.

Theme 1: Regional System

Theme Speaker - Dave Fischer (confirm)

The concept of a Regional Park System could take a number of different forms based on how the system is defined, whether resources are shared and how funding is sought to achieve overall goals. This theme discussion would be lead by Dave Fischer (St Louis Regional Parks) to describe the model of a regional park system that is currently being used in Minneapolis and now in St. Louis. This session will help answer the questions: 1) What could our regional system look like and how would we get there? 2) What are the advantages of approaching delivery of parks services on a regional basis and how do we create a funding source to approach business this way?

Theme 2: Marketing and Communication

Theme Speaker - David Thorpe (confirm)

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David Thorpe from Ziba design will be under contract by Metro to make this presentation for this track. Ziba Design will lead a discussion on developing a business model to market the regional system of parks and green spaces. Some of the questions that may be addressed in their presentation are: 1) Does the public recognize the value of parks and open spaces? 2) Do we describe and market parks to the public in the most efficient manner? 3) Are there different or more effective ways to provide park services or facilities to the public?

Theme 3: Federal and State Agenda

Theme Speaker - Charlie Hales (confirm)

This theme is designed to identify and discuss a topic that can be developed to demonstrate the value of regional collaboration to achieve a shared goal. The Regional Trails system cannot be implemented or funded by one entity. The overall system ahs been largely defined and pieces of the system are currently being built. The Federal and State delegations have an interest in building this system because of its recreational and transportation value. With a defined agenda that is supported regionally the chances of successfully receiving a significant allocation of transportation dollars to complete the system is more likely.

Actions Desired:

- 1. Engage/inspire participants and issue a clear call to action.
- 2. Identify next steps of developing and implementing an action agenda for an improved system of parks, trails and natural areas and begin work on developing a funding source to address operational and capital needs.

January 17, 2007 Quarterly trails meeting lengthened to 1-4pm

Mel Huie is out of the country until early January. However, Gregg Everhart has confirmed that Sarah Shipley, conference planner for the Rails to Trails Conservancy, will be able to join the January 17th quarterly trails meeting. The meeting will be longer, 1-4pm, so that we can discuss the conference in more detail. The conference format is being modified so that the primary role for locals is to help with the mobile workshops, i.e., tours.

If you don't have conference in your new 2007 calendar, it will begin with an evening kick-off event on Wednesday August 8th. The tours are the last scheduled event, on Friday August 10th, 2-5pm. The initial plan is to aim for 3 tours that use transit and walking, 3 tours by bikes (since there seem to be about 90 bikes available for rent), and 2-3 tours by bus. RTC is also willing to consider offering additional, longer tours on Saturday, if there are local leaders. However, we expect many conference attendees to be interested in the Bite of Portland and Providence Bike-Pedal events happening on the weekend.

We will discuss potential tours during the last hour of the meeting so please bring maps and descriptions of your suggestions. Once we see the broad range of possibilities, we'll need to test routes and timing and select tours most likely to attract and educate the attendees. RTC needs to have titles and general descriptions for the selected tours by the end of February.
