FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND INFORMATION

The Metro Water Resources Policy Advisory Committee (WRPAC) was formed in the early 1980's to advise the Metro Council on technical matters related to Metro's Areawide Wastewater and Areawide Stormwater Management Plans. It now advises the Council on water issues related to Region 2040, urban reserves and the Regional Framework Plan. The committee's by-laws were last revised in 1996.

Several positions were added to WRPAC in October of 1996. At that time no one was named to represent the Clackamas River watershed because the Watershed Council was just forming and adopting its membership

On April 21, 1997 WRPAC received nominations from the Clackamas River Basin for a representative and alternate on WRPAC. The nominations are Scott Forrester and Lowell Hanna, respectively. WRPAC discussed to nominations and voted to forward them to the Metro Council with a neutral recommendation.
