

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to the Metro Charter, Chapter V Section 26 (1) (m), the Metro Council President is tasked with the appointment of citizen representatives on the Metro Policy Advisory Committee (MPAC). Council President Tom Hughes has appointed one citizen representatives to serve on the committee: Mr. Keith Mays. This resolution confirms these appointments.

Mr. Keith Mays is a partner at EWS North America LLC and Forest Industry Supply LLC. He is a member of the Sherwood School District Long Range Planning Committee, Friends of Tualatin River National Wildlife Refuge, Sherwood Area Chamber of Commerce, Work Systems Inc., Rotary Club of Sherwood, Sherwood YMCA Board of Managers, and Columbia-Willamette YMCA. He is the former Mayor of Sherwood as well as former Sherwood City Council President, President of Oregon Mayors Association, and Chair of Local Officials Advisory Committee to Land Conservation and Development Commission. He received a Bachelor of Science in Applied Physics from Linfield College.

ANALYSIS/INFORMATION

1. **Known Opposition**: None

2. Legal Antecedents:

The Metro Charter V Section 26 (1) (m), provides that MPAC shall include three citizens appointed by the Council President and confirmed by the Council.

MPAC by-laws specify that citizen appointments are to be for a term of not less than two years. Taking this into account, staff recommends that these appointments to MPAC be for a two-year term, commencing upon confirmation.

- 3. Anticipated Effects: New citizen members will be appointed to MPAC.
- 4. Budget Impacts: None.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends the adoption of Resolution No. 14-4505.



STAFF REPORT

IN CONSIDERATION OF ORDINANCE NO. 14-1325, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ANNEXING TO THE METRO BOUNDARY APPROXIMATELY 10.57 ACRES LOCATED AT 17255 NW BRUGGER ROAD IN THE NORTH BETHANY AREA OF WASHINGTON COUNTY

BACKGROUND

CASE: AN-0114, Annexation to Metro District Boundary

PETITIONER: Emerio Design

6107 SW Murray Blvd., Suite 147

Beaverton, OR 97008

PROPOSAL: The petitioner requests annexation of one property to the Metro District boundary

following the Metro Council's addition of the property to the Urban Growth Boundary (UGB) in 2002. The applicant is currently in the process of annexing the subject

properties to the necessary service districts in Washington County.

LOCATION: The property is located in the North Bethany Area of Washington County at 17255 NW

Brugger Road and is 10.57 acres in size. A map of the area can be seen in Attachment 1.

ZONING: The property is zoned for residential and institutional use (R-6 NB, R-15 NB, R-24 NB &

INST NB) by Washington County.

The proposal consists of one tax lot. The land was added to the UGB in 2002 and is part of the North Bethany Subarea Plan that was adopted by Washington County. The land must be annexed into the Metro District for urbanization to occur.

APPLICABLE REVIEW CRITERIA

The criteria for an expedited annexation to the Metro District Boundary are contained in Metro Code Section 3.09.070.

3.09.070 Changes to Metro's Boundary

(E) The following criteria shall apply in lieu of the criteria set forth in subsection (d) of section 3.09.050. The Metro Council's final decision on a boundary change shall include findings and conclusions to demonstrate that:

1. The affected territory lies within the UGB;

Staff Response:

The subject parcel was brought into the UGB in 2002 through the Metro Council's adoption of Ordinance No. 02-987A.

2. The territory is subject to measures that prevent urbanization until the territory is annexed to a city or to service districts that will provide necessary urban services; and

Staff Response:

The conditions of approval for Ordinance No. 02-987A include a requirement that Washington County apply interim protection measures for areas added to the UGB as outlined in Urban Growth Management Functional Plan Title 11: Planning for New Urban Areas. Title 11 requires that new urban areas be annexed into the Metro District Boundary prior to urbanization of the area. Washington County also requires the land to be annexed into the appropriate sanitary sewer, water, park and road service districts prior to urbanization occurring. The applicant is currently moving forward with the necessary annexation requirements with Washington County. These measures ensured that urbanization would occur only after annexation to the necessary service districts is completed.

3. The proposed change is consistent with any applicable cooperative or urban service agreements adopted pursuant to ORS Chapter 195 and any concept plan.

Staff Response:

The property proposed for annexation is part of Washington County's North Bethany County Service District, established by the County Board of Commissioners on June 7, 2011. The proposed annexation is consistent with that agreement and is required by Washington County as part of a land use application. The inclusion of the property within the Metro District is consistent with all applicable plans.

ANALYSIS/INFORMATION

Known Opposition: There is no known opposition to this application.

Legal Antecedents: Metro Code 3.09.070 allows for annexation to the Metro District boundary.

Anticipated Effects: This amendment will add approximately 10.57 acres to the Metro District. The land is currently within the UGB in unincorporated Washington County. Approval of this request will allow for the urbanization of the parcel to occur consistent with the North Bethany Subarea Plan.

Budget Impacts: The applicant was required to file an application fee to cover all costs of processing this annexation request, thus there is no budget impact.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends adoption of Ordinance No. 14-1325.
