WHEREAS, there are vacancies in MCCI membership with appointments to be made in District 5; and



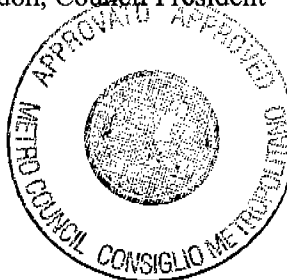
BE IT RESOLVED that the Metro Council President appoints Edmund B. Ruttledge as a member of MCCI.

## **BACKGROUND**

The Metro Committee for Citizen Involvement (MCCI) has continued to attempt to fill its vacancies. MCCI has actively recruited new members, including soliciting stakeholders and local leaders for nominees, notifying agency staff, and advertising on a weekly basis.

Edmund B. Rutledge lives in District 5. The MCCI Steering Committee has recommended Mr. Rutledge for this District 5 position citing his interest in land use and transportation planning, particularly regarding responsible transportation planning for bicyclists.
