WHEREAS, New members are required to maintain the geographic, industry, and citizen balance; and


WHEREAS, The Executive Officer has authority to appoint members to this committee for Council confirmation; now, therefore,



SOLID WASTE COMMITTEE REPORT

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. 91-1421, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENTS OF KENT FRUTIGER, LINDA MULLEN, AND EMILIE KROEN TO FILL VACANCIES ON THE 1% FOR RECYCLING COMMITTEE

Date: April 3, 1991

Presented by: Councilor McLain

Committee Recommendation: At the April 2, 1991 meeting the Committee voted 4-0 to recommend Council adoption of Resolution No. 91-1421. Voting in favor were Councilors DeJardin, Gardner, McFarland, and McLain. Councilor Wyers was excused.

Committee Issues/Discussion: Judith Mandt, Assistant to the Solid Waste Director, outlined the status of 1% program activities, and introduced the appointees.

Councilor McFarland noted that concerns have been expressed about results obtained from the program, and that some Councilors have wondered if the money would be better spent elsewhere.

Councilor McFarland also noted that Mr. Frutiger is a former board member of the Inskeep Environmental Learning Center, an organization which submits 1% proposals from time to time. She said she hoped that if a proposal came before him involving the Center, he would declare a conflict of interest and would refrain from voting. Mr. Frutiger said he would be prepared to do so. Councilor DeJardin said he viewed the 1% program as a think tank with funds available, and that he was not certain the situation would create a conflict of interest, since Mr. Frutiger would not personally benefit. He stated, and Councilor McFarland concurred, that Mr. Frutiger brings experience of value to the 1% Committee. Councilor McFarland reiterated her concern, and noted that Mr. Frutiger is prepared to refrain from voting in these situations.
