PROPOSED ACTION:

To adopt a resolution naming Rebecca Read to serve as a citizen alternate on the Metro Policy Advisory Committee (MPAC) representing Metro. Council approval constitutes confirmation as required by the Metro Charter and Metro Code Section 6.01.030.
