WHEREAS, Objective 1.1 of the Regional Urban Growth Goals and Objectives states that Metro shall establish a Regional Citizen Involvement Coordinating Committee to assist with development, implementation and evaluation of its citizen involvement program; and

WHEREAS, the Metro Charter also called for the creation of an Office of Citizen Involvement, and the establishment of a citizens committee therein; and

WHEREAS, the Metro Council created said Office and established Metro Committee for Citizen Involvement (MCCI) as the citizen committee within that Office, by adopted Ordinance No. 93-0479A; and

WHEREAS, the MCCI Chair requests that Kate Schiele be appointed from an at-large position to a District 2 seat, and

WHEREAS, there are vacancies in MCCI membership with appointments to be made to the Multnomah County Committee for Citizen Involvement position and the at-large position vacated by Kate Schiele's appointment to District 2, and


WHEREAS, a recruitment and selection process has been initiated, resulting in the nomination of citizens David Bikman (Exhibit A) and Jeannie "J.C." Kizak (Exhibit B) to represent District 2 and the Multnomah County Committee for Citizen Involvement; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Metro Council President appoints David Bikman to an at-large position, Jeannie "J.C." Kizak to the Multnomah County Committee for Citizen Involvement seat, and Kate Schiele to a District 2 position as members of MCCI.



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

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STAFF REPORT

IN CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. 3460, FOR THE PURPOSE OF APPOINTING DAVID BIKMAN AS AN AT-LARGE MEMBER OF THE METRO COMMITTEE FOR CITIZEN INVOLVEMENT (MCCI), ACCEPTING THE MULTNOMAH COUNTY OFFICE OF CITIZEN INVOLVEMENT NOMINATION OF JEANNIE (J.C.) KIZAK TO MCCI, AND RE-APPOINTING KATE SCHIELE FROM AN AT-LARGE POSITION TO A DISTRICT 2 POSITION ON MCCI.

BACKGROUND

MCCI has continued to attempt to fill its vacancies. In addition to personal contacts, MCCI has distributed information to neighborhood groups and initiated follow-up recruiting.

David Bikman is a member of the Buckman Neighborhood Association and has many years of experience volunteering on numerous local and regional committees and task forces. He is currently studying economics and urban planning at Portland State University where he is a full-time student and research assistant. MCCI recommends appointing Mr. Bikman as an at-large member. His application to the committee is attached to Resolution 02-3460 as Exhibit A.

Jeannie "J.C." Kizak is a neighborhood activist and has extensive volunteer experience with the Concordia Neighborhood Association, her church and the Multnomah County Citizens Involvement Committee. A letter from the Multnomah County CCI recommending Ms. Kizak as their representative to MCCI is attached to Resolution 02-3460 as Exhibit B.

Kate Schiele has been an at-large member of MCCI since her appointment in February 2002. She resides in district 2 and re-appointing her from an at-large position to a district seat opens up a position for an additional committee member. Ms. Schiele's 2002 application is attached to Resolution 02-3460 as Exhibit C.
