PROPOSED ACTION

To adopt a resolution naming Ted Wheeler and Wilda Parks as citizen members and Dresden Gregory and Ed Gronke as citizen alternates on the Metro Policy Advisory Committee (MPAC) representing Metro. Council approval constitutes confirmation as required by the Metro Charter and Metro Code Section 6.01.030.

BACKGROUND

Ted Wheeler is an active and involved member of the community (see Exhibit A). He has served on many community organizations and advisory committees. He is currently an Independent Investor for Lhotse Capital Management. Ted graduated from Stanford University with a BA in Economics, from Columbia University with Master of Business Administration, and from Harvard University with a Master of Public Policy. He is an author and lecturer who enjoys hiking, camping and mountaineering.

Dresden Gregory is a Product Stewardship Coordinator for Xerox Corporation, helping to make printers more environmentally sustainable. She has a Master of Science in Environmental Science and Engineering from Oregon Graduate Institute, and a Bachelor of Science in Environmental Science from Texas Christian University (see Exhibit B). Dresden has 8 years of environmental experience working with industries. She is a member of the Metro Committee for Citizen Involvement (MCCI), as well as three other community-based groups, including 2 years as Chairperson on the Fairview Creek Watershed Council.

Wilda Parks ACE, is the President/CEO of the North Clackamas County Chamber of Commerce (see Exhibit C). She graduated from the University of San Francisco with a degree in Organization Management in 1986 and completed the six-year program of the U.S. Chamber, Institute for Organization Management in 1989, then served two years as Advisor for Institute's incoming classes. She spearheaded an economic development project in California that received a national award of excellence for public-private partnerships in 1989.

Ed Gronke has served on MPAC as a Citizen Member since July 2000 and has been a business representative observer to MPAC since 1994 (see Exhibit D). He is an active and involved member of the community serving g on many community organizations and advisory committees. Ed was the Chair for the Clackamas County Jobs Plus Implementation Council from 1994 – 2002, and a member of Jennings Lodge Community Planning Organization since its inception. He is the President of the Rinearson Neighborhood Association.

I recommend the appointment of Ted Wheeler, Dresden Gregory, Wilda Parks, and Ed Gronke to MPAC. I believe they will provide an important voice representing local citizens.

MPAC's bylaws specify that citizen appointments are to be for a term of not less than two years. Taking this into account, I recommend that these appointments to MPAC be for an unspecified term, subject to later review.
