CLASSIFICATION DESCRIPTION

Provide protections of MERC facilities against trespass, vandalism, theft, fire or other threats through patrol of facilities.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

An employee in this classification may perform any of the following duties. However, these examples do not include all the specific tasks that an employee in this classification may be expected to perform.

- 1. Patrols assigned MERC facilities on foot, at times walking, at times running; checks in at computer watch clock stations at appointed times.
- 2. Investigates suspicious persons or activities.
- 3. Answers questions and provides information to the public; investigates complaints and recommends corrective action as necessary to resolve complaints.
- 4. Assists medical personnel by directing traffic, crowd control and securing needed equipment.
- 5. Checks facilities and equipment for needed maintenance and repairs; turns lights and alarms on and off.
- 6. Maintains time, equipment use and incident records.
- 7. Maintains radio communications with supervisors and other security agents.
- 8. Monitors the entry and departure of persons at the stage door.
- 9. Monitors fire alarms and determines validity; monitors closed circuit television (CCTV), and building access system, and calls for help; assists in the evacuation of patrons and employees in emergencies; provides medical assistance.
- 10. Apprehends, detains and arrests persons who violate local, state and federal laws.
- 11. Performs other related duties as assigned.

JOB SPECIFICATIONS EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

High school diploma or GED and one year of responsible experience in providing security for a large facility or any combination of education and experience that provides the necessary knowledge, skills and abilities to perform the classification duties and responsibilities. Possess or have the ability to obtain an unconcealed weapons permit. Possess or have the ability to obtain a CPR/AED certification and a First Aid certification. Possess or have the ability to obtain a DPSST certification.

KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITITES

- Materials, methods, practices and equipment used in facility security services
- Safe work practices
- Maintain operational records and prepare related reports

- Work shifts as necessary

- Adjust lighting from a control panel
- Accurately assess a medical situation and respond appropriately
- Correctly complete and issue a Multnomah County Parking Citation
- Run from one area of the facility to another in an emergency situation
- Chase, apprehend, detain and arrest suspect
- Protect one's self in an altercation

WORK ENVIRONMENT

This position requires the ability to perform those activities to complete the essential functions of the job, either with or without reasonable accommodation. Mental activities required by the employee in this position include dealing with highly stressful situations, decision making, interpersonal skills, teamwork, creativity, customer service, use of discretion, problem analysis, negation, and the ability to perform math and to read, write, speak and understand English. Required physical activities can include frequent walking, frequent running, talking, repetitive motions of hands and wrists, sitting, hearing and lifting, pushing, pulling, and carrying objects up to 20 pounds. Incumbents in this position need to be able to stoop and crawl in tight spaces. Incumbents in this position may be exposed to hazardous conditions related to natural and intentional disasters and threats including firearms. Incumbents in this position may be exposed to inclement weather conditions.
