CLASSIFICATION DESCRIPTION

Function as a member of the veterinary care team which includes responsibilities for animal veterinary care triage, coordination, administration, ongoing consultation with animal keepers and curators, and for hospital surgery, anesthesia, dental, lab and other tech functions, and hospital animal keeper services. Assist the veterinarians with a variety of technical duties such as emergency services, assisting in developing innovative procedures, implementation of various lab tests, serve as resource on animal nursing care, nutrition, health records, observation and medical treatment, and preparation of lab specimens, testing and analysis.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Tasks listed are intended to be descriptive and not restrictive. An employee in this classification may perform any of the tasks listed; however, these examples do not include all the tasks which an employee may be expected to perform.

- 1. Plans and coordinates with veterinarians and other colleagues, day-to-day duties to reflect emergency services, animal care needs, and changing priorities. Functions as technician for surgery, anesthesia, lab, dental or other hospital technician, and serves as a hospital animal keeper.
- 2. Performs animal care veterinary triage functions and serves as a resource to animal keepers and curators, and provides ongoing communications to the veterinarians.
- 3. Performs tests of medical laboratory samples including animal blood, urine, and feces. Sends samples to off-site labs and helps develop and decide which tests to use and how to adapt them to situations.
- 4. Sets up, prepares and maintains animal health records relating to laboratory tests and analysis, medical treatments, births, etc.
- 5. Administers oral, injectable, and topical medications to zoo animals as prescribed by veterinarians and dispenses medications to animal keepers. Prepares designated doses and provides keeper education on proper administration and observations.
- 6. Prepares and feeds prescribed diets to assigned animals, noting and recording food-consumption, stool consistency, injury progress, and any other relevant events, observations or changes.
- 7. Cleans instruments and work areas following medical procedures and sterilizes surgical instruments and darts. Sets up instruments prior to procedures.
- 8. Assists veterinarians in animal immobilizations including monitoring anesthesia, restraining animals, and moving awake and anesthetized animals.
- 9. Exposes and develops radiographs on awake and anesthetized animals.

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- 10. Prepares surgery room, ensures that necessary equipment is present for surgery. Works as surgical nurse, monitoring anesthesia and providing veterinarian with required instruments and equipment.
- 11. Observes zoo animals for possible signs of illness and confers with animal keepers and curators about animal health. Analyzes stool samples for presence of parasites. Refers detected signs of animal health problems to veterinarian for diagnosis.
- 12. Cleans and disinfects animal hospital cages regularly. Sweeps and mops floors, washes and cleans dishes and other equipment in the hospital and quarantine areas.
- 13. Maintains supply and medication inventory and orders as necessary.
- 14. Conducts tours of the hospital and provides information to the public.
- 15. Provides animal training assistance.
- 16. Compiles data for a variety of reports.
- 17. Assists the public, public officials and other employees in a professional and courteous manner.
- 18. Develops safe work habits and contributes to the safety of self and co-workers.
- 19. Contributes to a positive team atmosphere.
- 20. Has regular and punctual attendance.
- 21. Performs assigned duties during an emergency situation.
- 22. Other duties as assigned.
