The transportation improvements contained in the MTIP address a broad range of multi-modal transportation issues. The document meets all applicable state and federal requirements and was developed with extensive public involvement and close collaboration of local agencies and the Oregon Department of Transportation. The Metro MTIP was formally approved by the Policy Board and in accordance with federal requirements is to be approved by the Governor and incorporated into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) without amendment.

This action will ensure the timely undertaking and completion of transportation projects throughout the state and the continued flow of federal transportation funds to Oregon.
