# CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. 05-3579 FOR THE PURPOSE OF APPROVING THE FY 2005-06 BUDGET AND TRANSMITTING THE APPROVED BUDGET TO THE TAX SUPERVISING AND CONSERVATION COMMISSION

# BACKGROUND

On April 7, 2005, the FY 2005-06 Proposed Budget was presented to the Metro Council.

During the month of April a series of public work sessions and public hearings on the budget were held. The Council discussed budget issues with department directors and staff and received testimony from interested members of the general public and Metro stakeholders. Amendments to the Proposed Budget were developed, discussed and deliberated by the Council. A summary of all proposed amendments is attached. Those amendments approved by the Council are included in the Approved Budget.

This action taken by this resolution is the interim step between initial proposal of the budget and final adoption of the budget in June. Oregon Budget Law requires that Metro approve and transmit its budget to the Tax Supervising and Conservation Commission (TSCC). Members of the TSCC are appointed by the Governor to supervise local government budgeting and taxing activities in Multnomah County. The TSCC will hold a public hearing on Metro's budget scheduled for Wednesday, June 8, 2005 at 3:00 p.m. in the Metro Council Chamber. Following the meeting, the TSCC will provide a letter of certification for Metro's budget at which time the Council will formally adopted the final budget for FY 2005-06. The adoption of the budget is currently scheduled for Thursday, June 16, 2005.

# **ANALYSIS/INFORMATION**

- 1. Known Opposition None known at this time.
- 2. Legal Antecedents The preparation, review and adoption of Metro's annual budget is subject to the requirements of Oregon Budget Law, ORS Chapter 294. Oregon Revised Statutes 294.635 requires that Metro prepare and submit its approved budget to the Tax Supervising and Conservation Commission by May 15, 2005. The Commission will conduct a hearing during June 2005 for the purpose of receiving information from the public regarding the Council's approved budget. Following the hearing, the Commission will certify the budget to the Council for adoption and may provide recommendations to the Council regarding any aspect of the budget.
- 3. Anticipated Effects Adoption of this resolution will authorize the transmittal of the approved budget to the Tax Supervising and Conservation Commission.
- 4. **Budget Impacts** The total amount of the proposed FY 2005-06 annual budget was \$270,782,526. Changes to the proposed budget were identified during the month of April. The Council voted on proposed amendments to the budget April 28, 2005. A revised budget summary and schedule of appropriations will be available at the time of budget approval on May 5, 2005.

## **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

The Council President recommends adoption of Resolution No. 05-3579 approving the FY 2005-06 budget and authorizing the Chief Operating Officer to submit the approved budget to the TSCC.

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
