PORTER YETT-WAYBO-ROSELAWN GRAVEL PITS

The Porter Yett, Waybo and Roselawn Gravel Pits are located in Multnomah County between SE 67th and 79th near Killingsworth Street (Figures 1 and 2). Specifically, they are located in Section 20 Township 1 North, Range 2 East. The nearest community to the site is Parkrose which is 1½ miles away. The pits are zoned industrial. On site geology consists of lacustrine deposits. Annual percipitation is 50 inches per year. The Site is approximately 13 miles from Rossman's Landfill in Oregon City. All three pits are within 10,000 feet of Portland International Airport.

WAYBO PIT

The Waybo Site is a 15-acre gravel pit located on NE Killingsworth Street just off 82nd Avenue. The pit is bounded by commercial establishments on the east, residential housing on the south, another small gravel pit on the west, and NE Killingsworth on the north. Access to the Waybo site is off NE Killingsworth from 82nd Avenue or Columbia Boulevard.

Limited cover material is available on site. Capacity of the Waybo-Roselawn Pits combined is 1,900,000 tons. Groundwater appears to be approximately 30 feet below the floor of the pit.

ROSELAWN PIT

The Roselawn Pit consists of 16 acres owned by Portland Sand and Gravel. Surrounding the pit are homes, a gravel pit, school and a park. Sixteen homes exist within 500 feet of the pit. The nearest surface waterway is a drainage slough 1½ miles away from the pit. Some cover material is available on site. The combined capacity of the Roselawn-Waybo Pits are 1,900,000 tons.

PORTER YETT PIT

The Porter Yett site is a 42-acre gravel pit located in Northeast Portland. The site is bounded by Cully Boulevard on the east, the Union Pacific Railroad tracks and warehouses on the north, NE Portland Highway on the south, and some residences on the west. Access to the site is off Cully Boulevard from N.E. Portland Highway or Columbia Boulevard. Cover material is not available on site.

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
