

IN CONSIDERATION OF ORDINANCE NO. 15-1360, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ANNEXING TO THE METRO BOUNDARY APPROXIMATELY 89 ACRES LOCATED EAST AND WEST OF SW ROY ROGERS ROAD AND WEST OF SW $150^{\rm TH}$ AVENUE IN THE RIVER TERRACE AREA OF TIGARD

BACKGROUND

CASE: AN-0415, Annexation to Metro District Boundary

PETITIONER: Polygon Northwest Co. LLC

109 E 13th Street Vancouver, WA 98660

PROPOSAL: The petitioner requests annexation of 15 parcels to the Metro District boundary. The

applicant is currently in the process of annexing the subject property to the Clean Water

Services service district.

LOCATION: The parcels are located east and west of SW Roy Rogers Road and west of SW 150th

Avenue in the River Terrace area of Tigard and total 89 acres in size. A map of the area

can be seen in Attachment 1.

ZONING: The property is zoned for residential use (R-4.5, R-7 and R-25) by Tigard.

The land was added to the UGB in 2002 and is part of the River Terrace Community Plan that was adopted by Tigard. The land must be annexed into the Metro District for urbanization to occur.

APPLICABLE REVIEW CRITERIA

The criteria for an expedited annexation to the Metro District Boundary are contained in Metro Code Section 3.09.070.

3.09.070 Changes to Metro's Boundary

(E) The following criteria shall apply in lieu of the criteria set forth in subsection (d) of section 3.09.050. The Metro Council's final decision on a boundary change shall include findings and conclusions to demonstrate that:

1. The affected territory lies within the UGB;

Staff Response:

The subject parcel was brought into the UGB in 2002 through the Metro Council's adoption of Ordinance No. 02-969B.

2. The territory is subject to measures that prevent urbanization until the territory is annexed to a city or to service districts that will provide necessary urban services; and

Staff Response:

The conditions of approval for Ordinance No. 02-969B include a requirement that Washington County apply interim protection measures for areas added to the UGB as outlined in Urban Growth Management Functional Plan Title 11: Planning for New Urban Areas. Title 11 requires that new urban areas be annexed into the Metro District Boundary prior to urbanization of the area. Washington County applied the Future Development 20 (FD-20) zone to the expansion area. The subject property was annexed to Tigard in August 2011 and January 2013 and the River Terrace Community Plan was adopted in 2014. The applicant is currently moving forward with annexation to Clean Water Services. These measures ensured that urbanization would occur only after annexation to the necessary service districts is completed.

3. The proposed change is consistent with any applicable cooperative or urban service agreements adopted pursuant to ORS Chapter 195 and any concept plan.

Staff Response:

The property proposed for annexation is part of Tigard's River Terrace Community Plan Area, adopted by the City of Tigard in 2014. The proposed annexation is consistent with the community plan and is required by Tigard as part of a land use application. The inclusion of the property within the Metro District is consistent with applicable cooperative urban service agreements.

ANALYSIS/INFORMATION

Known Opposition: There is no known opposition to this application.


Legal Antecedents: Metro Code 3.09.070 allows for annexation to the Metro District boundary.

Anticipated Effects: This amendment will add approximately 89 acres to the Metro District. The land is currently within the UGB and within the City of Tigard. Approval of this request will allow for the urbanization of the parcels to occur consistent with the River Terrace Community Plan.

Budget Impacts: The applicant was required to file an application fee to cover all costs of processing this annexation request, thus there is no budget impact.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends adoption of Ordinance No. 15-1360.





BACKGROUND

CASE: AN-0315, Annexation to Metro District Boundary

PETITIONER: Polygon Northwest Company

PROPOSAL: The petitioner requests annexation of one parcel to the Metro District boundary. The

applicant is currently in the process of annexing the subject property to the necessary

service districts in Washington County.

LOCATION: The parcel is located at tax lot 1N117A000500 in the North Bethany Area of Washington

County. The parcel is 8.4 acres in size. A map of the area can be seen in Attachment 1.

ZONING: The property is zoned for residential use (R-9 NB, R-15NB, R-24NB) by Washington

County.

The land was added to the UGB in 2002 and is part of the North Bethany Subarea Plan that was adopted by Washington County. The land must be annexed into the Metro District for urbanization to occur.

APPLICABLE REVIEW CRITERIA

The criteria for an expedited annexation to the Metro District Boundary are contained in Metro Code Section 3.09.070.

(E) The following criteria shall apply in lieu of the criteria set forth in subsection (d) of section 3.09.050. The Metro Council's final decision on a boundary change shall include findings and conclusions to demonstrate that:

Staff Response:

The subject parcel was brought into the UGB in 2002 through the Metro Council's adoption of Ordinance No. 02-987A.

2. The territory is subject to measures that prevent urbanization until the territory is annexed to a city or to service districts that will provide necessary urban services; and

Staff Response:

The conditions of approval for Ordinance No. 02-987A include a requirement that Washington County apply interim protection measures for areas added to the UGB as outlined in Urban Growth Management Functional Plan Title 11: Planning for New Urban Areas. Title 11 requires that new urban areas be annexed into the Metro District Boundary prior to urbanization of the area. Washington County also requires the land to be annexed into the appropriate sanitary sewer, water, park and road service districts prior to urbanization occurring. The applicant is currently moving forward with the necessary annexation requirements with Washington County. These measures ensured that urbanization would occur only after annexation to the necessary service districts is completed.

3. The proposed change is consistent with any applicable cooperative or urban service agreements adopted pursuant to ORS Chapter 195 and any concept plan.

Staff Response:

The property proposed for annexation is part of Washington County's North Bethany County Service District, established by the County Board of Commissioners on June 7, 2011. The proposed annexation is consistent with that agreement and is required by Washington County as part of a land use application. The inclusion of the property within the Metro District is consistent with all applicable plans.

ANALYSIS/INFORMATION

Known Opposition: There is no known opposition to this application.





TESTIMONY TO METRO AUGUST 27, 2015

For the record, my name is Eric Wentland and I am testifying on behalf of Greenway Recycling, where I am the Operations Manager, secretary, HR department, special projects manager, and occasionally push a broom.

Council President and members of the Council.

Greenway Recycling has been in the Solid Waste business since 2003 and licensed by both DEQ and Metro since that time. We are the best performing Recycling company in the Metro region, diverting from the landfill a higher percentage of material than any other facility in the Transfer System. We exist as a profitable company because of, not in spite of, the Metro taxes on Solid Waste, which have been the primary driver of the increased rate of recycling in the metropolitan area. Last fiscal year, Greenway Recycling recovered 25,140 TONS of recycled commodities from the mixed waste stream. An additional 13,551 TONS of source separated material was processed for our customers, saving them money, as well as preserving landfill space for the residents of the State of Oregon. We accomplished this on a mere 2.5 acres of recovered Brownfield in the NW Industrial area.

Over the last 12 years we have had hundreds of interactions with Metro Staff and are very familiar with the myriad of Codes, Laws, Regulations and Requirements that govern Solid Waste and a Solid Waste Facility. We know and understand how this very complex system operates. I am here today to speak to the Council about the process for the Proposed updates to Metro's solid waste code as published on your website between August 6 and August 20. To date, there has been no formal notification of these proposed changes to anyone in the industry other than publishing them on your website. Staff has presented these Draft Ordinances and the changes they propose as follows: "The proposed revisions include: adding and updating defined terms, clarifying and narrowing certain licensing exemptions, removing certain licensing and franchising requirements, adding administrative procedure provisions, and various other technical corrections that will help make the Metro Code more accessible and easier to use." Further, the staff report attached to these proposed code changes refers to them as "housekeeping". Far from "housekeeping", these revisions are in 10 separate documents totalling 126 pages that interact and cross reference to a myriad of State of Oregon Statutes and Administrative Rules (an additional 200 pages between ORS and OAR), Federal EPA law, all of the Metro code, Metro Administrative Procedures, various city and county regulations and policies, as well as making sweeping changes to the entire Metro Solid Waste Transfer System. A

system that, I might add, has been built through extensive interaction and with substantial public-private partnership over the last 30 years and is currently operating quite efficiently and without detriment to the public good, health or safety.

These proposed changes to the Metro Code would be the single most significant set of changes enacted, involving the Solid Waste industry, since the initial formation of Metro. The net effect of the extent and intent of some of these ordinances will be to remove solid waste from private facilities and drive it to Metro facilities. The resulting anti-competitive measures will reduce recycling throughout Metro, as your facilities have never recycled solid waste at the same percentage level as private facilities. The Staff Report tells you that these proposed changes are merely technical corrections and a "leveling of the playing field". As far as we can see, the only business this will help is Metro, helping to resolve their inability to compete with the private facilities. This looks like Competition by Regulation, when Metro already exempts their facilities from the rules the rest of us operate under, does not seem to be a way to honor your partners in these public-private partnerships.

Greenway Recycling welcomes and embraces change. We have been closely involved with Metro and DEQ during these last 12 years, often leading the way in areas like shingle recycling, shaker fines for Alternative Daily Cover and the investment in equipment to better sort and process solid waste so Recycled material can be produced. We are proud of the business that has been built within the current Regulatory environment. Our business supports 21 families with living wages. Our lowest paid employees now are less than \$2.00 per hour away from the \$15.00 hourly target that has been talked about these last couple of years. We always trade with local vendors first when we have the opportunity. We have loyal customers who brag about the Recycling rates that we are able to accomplish. It seems that Metro should be studying us and how we accomplish this while making a profit rather than looking for ways to tax and regulate us out of existence.


This successful public-private partnership is now threatened with extinction on barely 45 days notice. Yes, Metro published the proposed changes on its website. However, if you have never been regulated how would you know to even look? There are companies scheduled to be regulated that just this week are discovering its existence. Out of curiousity, at 11:00 this morning, I contacted the owner of Columbia Recycling; one of the facilities proposed to be licensed for the first time. He had absolutely no clue whatsoever what I was talking about. This is proof there has been no outreach to industry. Staff's handling of the situation suggests the plan is to pass the law and

then let everyone know about it. Is this what your partners in the industry are now to expect from Metro?

At first blush and even after some research, the changes proposed are sweeping and potentially devastating to our business. It appears that every private business involved in every facet of Solid Waste will be affected as well, some possibly to the point of putting them out of business. There is no immediate threat to public health or safety anywhere in the metropolitan region that creates the emergency status being given to these proposed changes. In the absence of some compelling reason to move forward in haste we are mystified as to this "need for speed", unless Council has directed Staff to make these changes by a particular deadline.

Just 6 months ago, Metro convened a Transfer System Configuration Project and invited all of the major stakeholders in the Solid Waste system to participate. Every private business in the industry sent a decisionmaker to the table to help inform that process. At the very first meeting the question was asked by Metro as to what needed to be changed and the unanimous answer around the table was that, although not perfect, the system as configured now, is working reasonably well. At no time during this process, where that task force has had monthly meetings with Metro, were any of these currently proposed code changes discussed or even mentioned by Staff. The proposed changes negate the entire Task Force process as it has been handled and appears to be Metro working in bad faith with industry.

We are asking that the Council direct Staff to withdraw these Draft Ordinances and start the process over and truly involve all of the stakeholders whose businesses will be directly influenced by changes in the system. We are also asking that this entire set of Draft Ordinances be put on hold until it can be better coordinated with the larger issue of what happens to our garbage in the future. With implications that will resonate for decades to come, spending a few months to get it right seems to be the prudent approach for an agency tasked with dealing with the taxpayers safety, well being and money.
