MINUTES OF THE METRO COUNCIL WORK SESSION MEETING

Tuesday, May 17, 2005 Metro Council Chamber

Council President Bragdon convened the Metro Council Work Session Meeting at 2:03 p.m.

1. DISCUSSION OF AGENDA FOR COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING, MAY 19, 2005/ ADMINISTRATIVE/CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER AND CITIZEN COMMUNICATIONS

Council President Bragdon reviewed the May 19, 2005 Council meeting agenda. He noted the Metropolitan Exposition Recreation Commission (MERC) budget adjustment. Dan Cooper, Metro Attorney, and Randy Tucker, Legislative Affairs Manager, briefed the Council on legislative issues that were on the forefront. Mr. Tucker talked about SB 245. Councilors provided feedback to Mr. Tucker on SB 245. They talked about the single two-year extension and if it was enough. Councilors raised issues of funding sources and the extension. Mr. Tucker spoke to several bills that related to SB 245. Michael Jordan, Chief Operating Officer (COO) asked would the Council trade a two-year extension and no opposition to a funding source or requesting a seven-year cycle. Councilors suggested continuing the conversation with local governments and those that helped us get something. Councilors urged a discussion at Metro Policy Advisory Committee (MPAC). Mr. Cooper briefed the Council on Measure 37. Councilors suggested getting closure, staying involved and defending the 2040 Growth Concept. Mr. Tucker said it was his impression that nothing may happen before the end of the session. He suggested putting a letter out that said that Metro supported the 2040 Growth Concept.

2. HEALTH AND WELFARE BENEFITS

Kevin Dull, Human Resources Labor Relations Manager, and Kerry Gilbreth, Benefits Manager, presented health insurance issues. Mr. Dull said they had received bids from Kaiser, ODS and CCIS on health care benefits. Ms. Gilbreth reported on the surveys that had been conducted over the past eight months. She talked about composite rates versus tiered rates. Mr. Dull said ODS had counter proposed and reduced their rate because we had received several bids. They had a status quo offering from this year to next year. Ms. Gilbreth summarized the two Kaiser options, one with a \$20 co-pay and one with a \$10 co-pay. Employees were in support of going to tiered rates based on three surveys conducted over the past several years. Councilor Hosticka asked about catastrophic coverage. Mr. Dull responded to his question. He spoke to going to a tiered plan. They were proposing a tier plan for the non-represented employees. They were discussing this option with the unions.

Issa Simpson, AFSCME Labor Union representative, thanked staff for their efforts on their review of the health care benefits. She said she was here representing all of the labor unions. They were in favor of continuing the ODS option as long as possible. They were also in favor of the two Kaiser plans. The labor unions had decided not to go to tiered rates as of this moment. She spoke to next steps. Ruth Scott, Human Resources Director, echoed her thanks as well.

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Councilors asked for revisions in the tiered rates based on the new information about the unions' decision to not go with tiered rates.

3. THE SUPERVISOR ACADEMY

Kevin Dull and Lisa Colling, Human Resources Department, talked about the current work force training program. Mr. Dull talked about leadership development and succession planning. He then spoke to career planning processes that they were considering.

Ms. Colling reviewed the Supervisor Academy. She noted the goals of the eight courses. They had received positive feedback about the courses managers had taken. Mr. Jordan talked about managers and spans of control. He also acknowledged the Human Resources Department.

5. TRANSIT ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT (TOD) AND CENTERS CRITERIA/MIXED USE AND HIGHER DENSITY ISSUES

Councilor Liberty introduced the topic. Phil Whitmore, Planning Department, provided a power point presentation on the subject (a copy of the presentation is included in the record) on the TOD and Centers Implementation programs. Mr. Whitmore reviewed the TOD and Centers projects that were currently in the process. Councilors asked about funding issues for the projects. Councilors discussed current criteria. Councilor Newman asked about design criteria and standards. Councilors talked about the success of the projects. Councilor Liberty talked about the market and what was the possible five-year to ten year forecast. Mr. Whitmore talked about Jerry Johnson and his expertise about the market. He had offered to come and talk with Council.

Councilors suggested having a round table discussion about the TOD and Centers issues.

6. COUNCIL BRIEFINGS/COMMUNICATIONS
