WHEREAS, the Metro Council adopted the Regional Urban Growth Goals and Objectives (RUGGOs) on September 26, 1991 by Ordinance 91-418B; and

WHEREAS, Citizen Participation is included in the RUGGOs as the first objective under Goal 1, The Regional Planning Process; and

WHEREAS, Objective 1.1 states that Metro shall establish a Regional Citizen Involvement Coordinating Committee (RCICC) to assist with the development, implementation and evaluation of its citizen involvement program; and

WHEREAS, these Bylaws identify the committee as the Metro Committee for Citizen Involvement (MCCI); and

WHEREAS, the Bylaws have been adopted by the Metro Council by Resolution No. 92-1580A on May 28, 1992; and subsequently revised three times, most recently by Resolution No. 94-1986 on November 22, 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Metro Charter called for the creation of an Office of Citizen Involvement, and the establishment of a citizens committee therein; and

WHEREAS, the Metro Council created said Office and established the MCCI as the citizen committee within that Office, by adopted Ordinance No. 93-0479A; and

WHEREAS, the Metro Council accepted the initial membership of the MCCI by Resolution No. 92-1666 on August 27, 1992 with subsequent rounds of applicants approved by





### **Education, work or volunteer experience**

I have recently retired from the U.S. Department of Energy. The following are items of my experience that I feel will be of interest to you.

- Responsible for operation, maintenance, and upgrades of infrastructure and utilities at Hanford. These included transportation, water, sewer, and electricity. Annual budget of approximately \$160M.
- Initiated the environmental restoration program at Hanford. Worked on plans and agreements to comply with RCRA and CERCLA. This included developing the initial list of priorities and the first drafts of the Community Action Plan.
- Served as Unit Manger for Operable Units at Hanford. Chaired meetings of US DOE, US EPA, and Washington Department of Ecology. Developed mutually agreeable Work Plans for reaching compliance with RCRA and CERCLA. Participated in the development of the Tri-Party Agreement.
- Significant experience in preparing, reviewing, and approving budgets of Government Programs.
- Experience in contract management including preparing Statements Of Work, schedules, and cost estimates; development and application of award criteria; monitoring of work progress, and negotiation of changes.
- Volunteer Member of the Washington Department of Ecology Central Regional Citizens Advisory Committee. This committee advised Ecology on matters of citizen concern.
- Served a three year term on the Board of Directors for Cave Bay Community Services, Inc. A homeowners association that manages infrastructure of a small community. Includes roads, water, and sewer. Served as Secretary for a year.

Virtually all of my career has involved boards and committees. These have been both within and outside my organizations. Many have been with several Government and private organizations and agencies. Most of the boards and committees have been used to arrive at mutually agreeable solutions to technical and administrative problems. Although some have been involved in operation of facilities.

**Name of the committees you are interested in and explain why you think the committee issues are important**

All the Metro Citizen Advisory Committees are important because public buy-in is the keystone of success for Metro. I am willing to help with any of the committees for which you feel I am qualified. I am not sure what all the committees do, however, the following are my thoughts:

Metro Committee for Citizen Involvement -- This committee is very important because it sets and monitors the process by which citizens will be notified of upcoming actions and how to become involved. It also determines how citizen concerns will be dealt with and how the results will be disseminated. The process will also determine how issues will be brought to closure and avoid endless rounds of comment and discussion.

Metro Committee for Transportation Policy Alternatives -- This committee advises Metro on transportation alternatives. Although the main transportation architecture has been determined, there will be many detailed issues to be resolved.

Metro Committee for North Portland Enhancement -- This committee approves grant requests to offset landfills in the area. This has special interest for me because I attended the University of Portland, thus am familiar with North Portland.

Metro Committee for Metro Central Enhancement -- See above.

I believe my experiences in infrastructure, utilities, transportation, environmental restoration, and construction have given me an insight into the issues that metro is resolving. I am familiar with bureaucracy and how to deal with it. I feel that I have capabilities in managing meetings; reviewing technical, administrative, and budget documents; fairly presenting diverse viewpoints to achieve resolution; arriving at resolution of controversial issues; and documenting viewpoints and resolutions.
