

As you remember, the staff was authorized to develop these items for the MSD Board review. In order to be timely with the MSD FY 75-76 budget preparation process, the MSD staff is recommending the Board review these documents and at the January 24, 1975 meeting the MSD Board should:

- 1) HOLD THE FIRST PUBLIC HEARING ON THE SOLID WASTE User Charge Ordinance; and
- 2) DISTRIBUTE THE MSD/LOCAL JURISDICTION SOLID WASTE AGREEMENTS.
