75-416 MSD SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT AND OPERATION PROGRAM RATE SCHEDULE ORDINANCE NO. 33 - Second Public Hearing

An ordinance establishing a user fee for the administration, implementation and operation of the areawide Solid Waste Management Program and prescribing an effective date.

As part of the DEQ budget note, the Legislature stipulated that MSD must provide a method of funding its administrative staff and guaranteeing loan repayment to the State prior to obtaining money from the State Pollution Bonds for the construction of the solid waste processing and disposal facilities. Ordinance No. 33 establishes a rate to be imposed for each cubic yard of solid waste delivered to a waste disposal site during Phase I. This phase of the solid waste program implementation is that period of time from the effective date of the ordinance to the activation of the first processing facility and the Washington County transfer station. Funds collected during Phase I will pay the MSD solid waste program administrative costs and the DEQ loan repayment.

As of Wednesday, November 12, 1975, no written comments have been received from the general public or the solid waste industry. The MSD Solid Waste Committee recommends adoption of Ordinance No. 33 after conducting a third public hearing. It was their contention that the notification procedure followed by the staff was not sufficient to inform the general public even though all legal requirements were met. (Legal notices were published in the Daily Journal of Commerce on November 7, 10, and 11. Notices were also sent to 13 local newspapers.) In response to their request, public notices of the hearing will be published in the Oregon Journal and the Oregonian on November 12 and November 13, 1975, stating the amount of the user fee and the impact on the residential collection charge.

In addition, a news release was sent to 13 Local newspapers reviewing Ordinance No. 33 and its initial affect on the residential collection rates as well as a projected increase in 1980.

It is the staff's recommendation that the Board <u>Adopt</u> Ordinance No. 33 after conducting the second public hearing, or if a third public hearing is desired, that it be <u>scheduled</u> for <u>Friday</u>, <u>November 28, 1975</u>, at 2:00 P.M.

75-417 MSD/PARKER NORTHWEST DRAFT CONTRACT

THE MSD/Parker Northwest draft contract will be submitted under separate cover at the MSD Board meeting. This draft contract is an agreement for Parker to design, construct and operate the Oregon City transfer/processing station and the Washington County transfer station. It should be noted that neither parties have agreed to the complete contract. This document is submitted and explained so that the Board can understand conceptually the staff's approach in developing this contract.

75-421 LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM COORDINATOR

This agenda item was set aside from the October 24, 1975, Board meeting for consideration at this time.

STAFF FEELS THAT IN ORDER TO PROPERLY PREPARE FOR THE EMERGENCY BOARD PRESENTATION, CERTAIN INFORMATION SHOULD BE COORDINATED AND DISSEMINATED PRECEDING OUR PRESENTATION TO THE LEGISLATORS. THREE APPARENT OPTIONS AVAILABLE WITHIN MSD'S RESOURCES ARE:

- 1) TO HIRE A PARTTIME PUBLIC INFORMATION CONSULTANT TO BE BUDGETED FROM OUR PUBLIC INFORMATION LINE ITEM.
 - 2) To seek a parttime person that would be payed through CETA II funds.
 - 3) To seek parttime support from the primary Local Jurisdictions within the MSD area.

PAGE 24 PRESENTS A LIST OF DUTIES THAT SHOULD BE ACCOMPLISHED IN ORDER TO PROPERLY PRESENT OUR POSITION TO THE LEGISLATORS.

THE STAFF WOULD REQUEST BOARD DIRECTION ON THIS MATTER.

75-422 CITIZEN APPOINTMENT TO MSD SOLID WASTE COMMITTEE

THE MSD STAFF HAS RECENTLY BEEN INFORMED THAT MR. BILL CULHAM, CURRENT CHAIRMAN OF THE SOLID WASTE ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPRESENTING THE CITY OF PORTLAND, INTENDS TO RETIRE FROM SERVICE TO THE CITY EFFECTIVE.

DECEMBER 24, 1975. MR. CULHAM HAS SUBSEQUENTLY RESIGNED FROM THE MSD SOLID WASTE COMMITTEE EFFECTIVE THIS SAME DATE. IT IS STAFF'S FEELING THAT THE VALUE OF MR. CULHAM'S INPUT TO THIS COMMITTEE SHOULD BE RETAINED AND COULD BE RETAINED IN THE FORM OF CITIZEN INVOLVEMENT.

IT IS STAFF'S RECOMMENDATION THAT BILL CULHAM BE APPOINTED AS A CITIZEN MEMBER OF THE MSD SOLID WASTE COMMITTEE, REPRESENTING THE CITY OF PORTLAND.

75-423 RESOURCE RECOVERY BYPRODUCT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

Submitted by staff under separate cover is a draft of an Environmental Assessment for a solid waste milling/transfer station at the Resource Recovery Byproducts site. The Report develops specific technical data which would be needed by the Board for a decision to use the RRB site instead of the North Portland Road site. The decision to use the RRB site instead of the North Portland Road site is not an issue at this time.

THE STAFF RECOMMENDS REVIEW OF THE REPORT FOR ACTION AT THE November 28, 1975, Board Meeting.

CONTRACT FOR AUDIT OF OREGON MUNICIPAL CORPORATION October 21, 1975 PARTIES: Metropolitan Service District, a municipal corporation (MSD), Coopers & Lybrand, a partnership (C & L). RECITALS: MSD is a municipal corporation subject to the municipal audit law (ORS 297.610 - 740). 2. C & L are accountants authorized by the State of Oregon to conduct municipal audits. IT IS AGREED: 3. C & L shall conduct an audit of the accounts and fiscal affairs of the MSD for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976. If unusual conditions arise or are encountered during the course of the audit whereby the services of C & L are necessarily beyond the extent of the work contemplated, written notification of such unusual conditions shall be delivered to MSD together with the expected costs of performing the additional services. C & L shall not proceed with the additional services until receiving written approval from the MSD. The audit field work shall be started as soon after this contract is executed as is agreeable to the parties and shall be completed on or before September 30, 1976. If for any reason the completion date cannot be attained, written notification of the circumstances shall be delivered to MSD, and with both parties in agreement, the deadline may be extended. A written report shall be rendered within a reasonable time after the close of the audit with 30 copies given to MSD. The form and content of the report shall be in accordance with and not less than that outlined in the minimum standards of audit reports, certificates and procedures.

- 6. The cost of the audit shall not exceed \$4,300 per year for performing the services required by this contract. Payment shall be made with a 1/3 retainer and be held until the final report is received.
- 7. This contract may be terminated by either party after giving the other party 30 days written notice of their intent to terminate. MSD shall be responsible for services performed to the date of termination.
- 8. The MSD hereby affirms that proper provision for the payment of such fee has been or will be duly made and that funds for the payment thereof are or will be made legally available.

SUBJECT: NEWS RELEASE

On Friday, November 14, 1975, at 2:00 PM, in the Portland Water Bureau Auditorium, 1800 SW Sixth Avenue, Portland, Oregon, the Board of Directors of the Metropolitan Service District will conduct the second public hearing on Ordinance 33. This ordinance establishes the rate for the first phase of a three phase approach implementing the areawide Solid Waste Management Plan. This plan proposes a new method in the metropolitan area of handling solid waste that will result in the recovery of 70 to 75 percent of all waste generated. By 1980, 463,000 tons of light combustible material separated from solid waste will be available for use as a fuel supplement, in addition to 45,000 tons of ferrous metals.

The rate established by Ordinance 33 will be 26¢ per cubic yard of compacted solid waste and 15¢ per cubic yard of noncompacted solid waste delivered to a waste disposal site. These fees will increase the monthly residential collection rate for weekly service of one 32 gallon garbage can approximately 8¢. It is estimated that the ultimate disposal cost for the MSD Solid Waste Program will increase the monthly collection rate approximately 30¢ in 1980.
