AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FY 1996-97 BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS SCHEDULE BY TRANSFERRING \$10,000 FROM PERSONAL SERVICES TO MATERIALS AND SERVICES IN THE MERC ADMINISTRATION FUND TO PROVIDE FOR UNANTICIPATED TEMPORARY LABOR NEEDS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY **ORDINANCE NO. 97-699**

WHEREAS, The Metro Council has reviewed and considered the need to transfer appropriations with the FY 1996-97 Budget; and

WHEREAS, The need for a transfer of appropriation has been justified; and WHEREAS, Adequate funds exist for other identified needs; now, therefore, THE METRO COUNCIL ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the FY 1996-97 Budget and Schedule of Appropriations are hereby amended as shown in the column entitled "Revision" of Exhibits A and B to this Ordinance for the purpose of transferring \$10,000 from the MERC Administration Fund materials and services appropriation to capital outlay for the purpose of providing funds for additional temporary help services.

2. This Ordinance being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety or welfare of the Metro area in order to meet obligations and comply with Oregon Budget Law, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Ordinance takes effect upon passage.

Background and Analysis: This \$10,000 budget amendment is anticipated to be necessary to prevent an over-expenditure of Materials & Services appropriations by yearend. MERC Administration has not exceeded their appropriations yet, however there are several items that will occur later which may create an over-expenditure. However time is against us and we will not have the opportunity to correct over-expenditures later in the fiscal year. The detail of the items which could create the over-expenditure follow:

- The Secretary/Receptionist position has not been filled and actual hiring is now projected to be late April or May. These duties include phone coverage for the office, back-up to the Executive Secretary, assistance to the Purchasing Manager for data collection and processing, data assembly and processing for the Accounting Staff and other duties as required to keep the office running smoothly. The necessary work and duties of this position has been provided through the usage of Temporary Labor personnel. Due to the delay in hiring, expenditures will exceed this line-item by approximately \$10,000.
- The Compensation Study is nearing its completion. However it is anticipated that further services of the contractor will be utilized to implement some or all of the corrections and changes that the Commission approves out of the report. The estimated costs for this additional work by contract could be up to \$11,000.
- A Memorandum of Understanding with Metro's Administrative Services Department has been issued regarding FY 1997-98 Support Service charges. This agreement will continue MERC's participation in Metro's accounting system which is in the process of implementing a new system. Our understanding is that this new system will require changes in our procedures and process in several areas plus the required training in this system will not begin until June. This implementation may create costs and changes in our services that we can not predict which are in addition to several other changes that MERC Administration will be incurring in the same time frame.

MERC Administration has sufficient budgetary reserves in Materials & Services to accommodate one unanticipated expense of \$10,000 but not \$20,000. An explanation of the specific appropriation transfer of \$10,000 from Personal Services to Temporary Labor is contained in the above issues.

Fiscal Impact: The movement of \$10,000 of Personal Services appropriations to Materials & Services has no impact on the total appropriations. It is necessary to move this appropriation to avoid potential over-expenditure of budget, which is a violation of Oregon Budget Law.

FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS

The Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission (MERC) passed Resolution No. 97-19 authorizing adjustments to the budget appropriations of the MERC Administration Fund. The resolution is attached for reference.

This budget adjustment moves appropriations from the personal services portion of the budget to materials and services. The adjustment is necessary due to changes in staff and a delay in the hiring of full time staff. This delay in hiring full time staff has required the use of temporary labor. The increase in expenditure in materials and services creates the possibility that this portion of the budget would exceed appropriations. If, at the end of the fiscal year, this budget were found to be over appropriations, it would be a violation of Oregon Budget Law.

The action requested of the Council prevents this violation.

FISCAL IMPACT

The requested budget adjustment of \$10,000 is reflected below:
