ISSUE STATEMENT

In Fall 2019, Metro Council directed staff to design a process for Council to have more direct influence in awarding sponsorships by pre-programming a portion of the Council Office's total sponsorship funds (approximately \$34,000) based on specific themes. Those themes would align with Council priorities. Utilizing many of the features of the current agency-wide sponsorship process including racial equity as a touchstone, staff presents a proposal for moving forward, taking into account our changed circumstances since the onset of COVID-19.

ACTION REQUESTED

Staff requests Council direction on the approach and specific criteria to prioritize for Council sponsorship allocations in FY 2020-21. Based on those criteria, staff will match criteria with the universe of non-profits that have previously requested sponsorship funds and return with a recommended list of organizations that meet those criteria. Staff also requests a final determination on allocation of funds to category 1 (pre-programmed by theme) and category 2 (funds reserved for unanticipated opportunities throughout the year).

IDENTIFIED POLICY OUTCOMES

During the October 22, 2019 Metro Council work session on sponsorships, and more recently on April 9, 2020, the Council articulated the values and adopted Metro policies that would guide their decisionmaking. Those policies include:

- The Strategic Plan to Advance Racial Equity, Diversity and Inclusion
- The Six Desired Outcomes
- The Construction Career Pathways framework
- Metro Council priorities including the Regional Investment Strategy

- The "What Metro Stands For" resolution, for the purpose of affirming support for our region's shared values (Resolution No. 19-5016)
- Commitment to employee welfare
- Applying a racial equity lens in regional response and recovery
- Continued support of Metro's partners

POLICY QUESTION(S)

The Metro Council articulated their desire to advance Council priorities by adding Council-specific criteria to the review process for Council sponsorships. In 2019, the Council also specified that sponsorship awards should be balanced across the region; awards should reflect a greater range of populations served; awards should be balanced between organizations new to sponsorship and to more established organizations; and that sponsorship should provide opportunities for Metro and councilor visibility. More recently the Council expressed their desire to realign resources post COVID-19 as possible, remain focused on racial equity, uphold the Metro Charter and protect the most vulnerable Metro employees and partners.

Sponsorships have long been a tool for Metro to demonstrate support for and build and strengthen relationships with community partners. With the onset of COVID-19, the value of sponsorships as a flexible and efficient tool for supporting the work of community based organizations whose work aligns with Metro has only grown.

POLICY OPTIONS FOR COUNCIL TO CONSIDER

The only requirements in disbursing sponsorship funds is that the funds must be used to promote a public purpose and Metro must receive some direct or indirect benefit in return for its sponsorship. As is the case currently, sponsorships are targeted to community based and non-profit organizations. Also, funding must not be provided to political committees, campaigns or lobbying groups, religious organizations and private individuals.

Staff has listed a number of potential themes below that could be used in pre-programming sponsorship awards. Council can choose from these or add additional themes.

- Public health
- Advocacy for underserved communities
- Emergency business assistance
- Climate justice
- Transportation
- Parks
- Construction careers for those underrepresented in the trades
- Disaster preparedness and resilience
- Affordable housing/homeless support services
- Food insecurity

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

Staff recommends approval of the process described above for awarding Council Office sponsorship funds.

Staff recommends clear articulation of Council priorities in awarding sponsorships for use in allocating funds for category 1 (pre-programmed funds in accordance with select themes) and category 2 (funds awarded during the year for unanticipated opportunities.

Staff also recommends that \$24,000 be used for category 1 and \$10,000 be used for category 2.
