### Reason for Modification and Summary of Changes plus Impacts:

The Admin Mod de-obligates \$14,400 from the Other phase and adds \$10k to the construction phase (total of \$25k) to address a minor construction phase funding shortfall. The cost increase to the project is \$10k increasing it to \$698,00. This equals a 1.4% cost increase and is less than the 20% threshold. The minor construction phase cost increase result from update final design estimates for the construction phase.

As stated in Clackamas County's request, the 232<sup>nd</sup> Drive ER project was delayed as the county went through the certification process for consultant selection. The procurement for consultant services was held back until the county received approval for consultant selection, resulting in a delay in moving the project to construction.

FHWA concurs with Clackamas County's request, thereby approving a one-year time extension to allow the county to advance the project to construction prior to September 30, 2020. The processing of ER requests and the delivery of ER projects shall be given prompt attention and shall be given priority over non-emergency work.
