

METROPOLITAN EXPOSITION-RECREATION COMMISSION

RESOLUTION NO. 90

Approving a five and one half percent (5.5%) adjustment to base salaries of Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission non-represented employees (included in MERC Resolution No. 30, adopted by the Commission February 14, 1990, and ERC Resolution No. 613, adopted June 14, 1989) making \$30,000 or less, retroactive to July 1, 1990.

The Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission finds:

1. That MERC's budget and personnel committees recommend a five and one half percent (5.5%) adjustment for Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission non-represented employees making \$30,000 or less, retroactive to July 1, 1990.

2. That for clarification purposes, this resolution does not affect any action taken under Resolution No. 68, adopted by the Commission June 13, 1990, which approved a one-percent one-time benefits adjustment to base wages of certain full-time non-represented employees (example attached as Exhibit A).

3. That adequate funds exist in the FY 1990-91 Budget and the budget adjustment will be made after the salary study is complete.

4. That any adjustment in salaries which affects personnel whose time is billed back to the permittees/promoters necessitates a modification to the Schedule of Extra Charges for labor.


BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED:


1. That the Commission approves a five and one half percent (5.5%) adjustment to base salaries of Metropolitan Exposition-Recreation Commission non-represented employees (included in MERC Resolution No. 30, adopted by the Commission February 14, 1990, and ERC Resolution No. 613, adopted June 14, 1989) making \$30,000 or less, retroactive to July 1, 1990.

2. That the Schedule of Extra Charges for the use of the Commission's facilities is modified to reflect the changes for non-represented labor increases, to be effective September 1, 1990.

Exhibit A

Example: An employee who was making, on July 1, 1990, \$20,585 per year, or \$9.8966 per hour, received a \$205.85 per year, or \$0.0990 per hour add-on, to their base wages. The proposed 5.5% would increase this person's base wages to \$21,717 per year, or \$10.4409 per hour, plus the add-on from Resolution No. 68, making their new pay rate \$10.5399 per hour ( $\$10.4409 + \$0.0990 = \$10.5399$ ).
