SUBJECT: Checking Account Signers

Background

Metro Exposition-Recreation Commission Resolution No. 73 passed by the Commission on June 13, 1990, established a Cash Management System for the Commission as recommended by Peat Marwick, report dated May 3, 1990. The Cash Management System was reviewed by Metro and MERC staff, and with Peat Marwick, who recommended the Metro Exposition-Recreation Commission approve the System.

The System set up checking accounts at First Interstate Bank, Lloyd Center Branch, as follows: a General Account of \$3,000 for the Convention Center and a General Account of \$4,000 for the Spectator Facilities; a Special Deposit Account for the Convention Center and the same for the Spectator Facilities. The General Accounts are used for relatively small emergency items, i.e; operating supplies, some postage, etc. Briefly, the Special Deposit Account are "third party" accounts set up to receive and disburse all event-related funds. Deposits to these accounts consist of box office receipts, outside ticketing agencies (Ticketmaster and Fastixx), and rental deposits for for events (a full explanation of how these accounts work was included in the June 1990, memorandum to the Commission).

Resolution No. 73 set up the checking accounts and authorized check signers (they require two signers). Resolution No. 99, passed by the Commission on November 14, 1990, changed one of the signers, from James Murphy, who retired, to Betty Curtis, and added the Commission's Secretary/Treasurer as an authorized signer, making the current authorized signers as follows:
