MERC STAFF REPORT

Agenda Item/Issue: Three-Year Limited License Agreement with Portland State

University for Football Program

DATE: June 14, 1995 Presented by: Candy Cavanagh

Background and Analysis: Portland State University has been contracting with Civic Stadium for many years to present their home football season games at the facility. Up to this point, the agreement have been initiated annually between the Stadium Manager and the PSU Athletic Department. Portland State University has now taken a big step and put in a bid to advance into NCAA Division I (most sports)/NCAA Division I-AA (football) as part of the Big Sky Conference beginning in 1996. There are several advantages surrounding this move: ease in scheduling and recruiting, lower travel costs, attendance increase because of closer rivalries and better visibility for the University within the community.

PSU must complete a probationary period of two (2) years and is looking for stability within their budget expense. The Stadium Manager has been in on-going negotiations with PSU staff and an agreeable set of terms has been reached. The terms have been reviewed by MERC's accounting staff and General Manager.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: Conservatively, the proposed agreement would increase Stadium revenues slightly. If significant attendance increases take place, Stadium revenues will increase proportionately.

<u>Discussions with Commission Liaisons and/or User Groups</u>: Full discussions have taken place with PSU Athletic and Financial Management staff members.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Staff recommends the Commission approve and authorize the Chairman and Secretary-Treasurer to sign the attached three-year Limited License Agreement with Portland State University.
